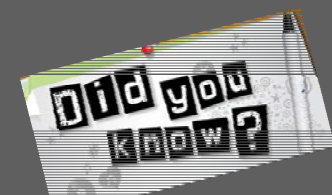

Council Highlights

Votes Taken:

- ♦ June Minutes were submitted and approved unanimously after a correction that Christie Cook attended on Zoom.
- ♦ George Crowe, sexton, has another job and his time to be available is less. A motion was made to hire Bobby Shumpert for 2 years at \$1,000 a month for cleaning of the church. George Crowe will still be available to help with setting up tables at 10 hours a week. The motion passed unanimously.
- ♦ A motion was made to give a Love Offering to Vicar Christine Taylor for \$1,500 from the Reserve Fund plus whatever donations are received up until she leaves mid-August. The motion passed unanimously.
- ♦ A motion was made to move the coffee time from the Assembly Room to the front of the church in the Augsburg SS Class Room and call it the "Mount Tabor Cafe". The motion passed unanimously.

FROM OUR VICAR

*“Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts.
They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts” Acts 2:46*

God shows us again and again through scripture just how powerful and necessary relationship is for God’s people. In the Gospels, we get stories of Mary and Elizabeth singing with one another and the disciples being sent out two by two. Even Jesus is cared for and accompanied by community. RSCM Carolina Course

I recently participated in the RSCM Carolina Course which was held at Duke University. The Course was led by Dr. Robert Poovey and accompanied on the organ by Stephen Gourley. Over the course of 5 days, the choir of 33 girls (grades 4-12) and 45 adults representing 12 states learned music for a Choral Eucharist and a Choral Evensong. The music included 2 significant anthems, 2 introits, 2 communion motets, as well as the Communion Service in E by Harold Darke, Preces and Responses by Kathe Wright Kaufman (commissioned by the course in celebration its 25 year anniversary), and Magnificat and Nunc dimittis by David Hurd. 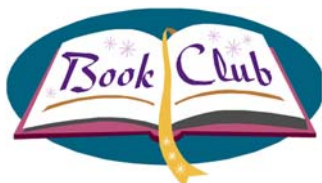


Wednesday Noon Eucharist

Items Included:

Pocket mask located on outside for ease of use with CPR.

The lock tag on each kit will be checked monthly and after receiving an incident report.

The expiration tag on the front right shows the date of the first item to expire. On or before that date, expiration dates for all items will be checked and a new lock tag placed and recorded.



Outside:

Left – Ammonia towelettes

Right – Thermometer and alcohol wipes to clean before and after use



First Shelf:

- First Aid Guide
- Gloves (2-pairs)
- Purell Hand Sanitizer
- Pulse oximeter
- Antibiotic ointment
- Hydrocortisone cream
- Burn gel
- 2 x 3 and 3 x 3 non-stick sponges
- Gauze rolls (2)



The QR code is found on the outside and inside the top of the First Aid Kit.
