#### **Council Highlights - January 14, 2024**

#### Votes Taken:

- Minutes were unanimously approved.
- February's Council Meeting will be held at the Council Retreat at River Bluff High School, February 11 from 2:30-5:30 PM

### Pastoral Ponderings

"Then I turned to the Lord GOD, to seek an answer by prayer and supplication with fasting and sackcloth and ashes." Daniel 9:3

Believe it or not, just a few short weeks ago, we celebrated Christmas Eve; that silent night with all the animals outside the stable, with the angels singing, and the little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay. Now today, I sit here and write to you about getting ready for Lent. It's hard to believe from that joyous celebration of life and light brought into the world, we shift so quickly to the darkness, suffering, and death that Lent brings.

That is the uniqueness of our Christian Church Calendar though, that it mimics the rhythms of our lives, and forces us to ride the roller coaster of life with all its ups and downs. We ride that roller coaster of life intentionally, so that we might come to understand these rhythms through the lens of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. This intentionality pulls us away from seeing our lives as a series of coincidences and helps to give our lives meaning and fulfillment in the hope that God is still working to save us from sin, death, and the devil. This massive shift from Advent to Lent, gives us the jolt we need to connect Christmas to Easter, and the incentive to grasp ahold of the salvation that is Jesus Christ.

This Lent, I hope you will participate with us through fasting, praying, and giving of yourself to worship that leads us to the cross. Adults and children alike can use this time to connect to the Holy Spirit's call, and see ourselves more clearly as God's forgiven and chosen people. I hope you will begin thinking and preparing yourselves to "give up" something for Lent, to participate with us as we set our hearts and soul toward the cross of Christ. I hope you will be intentional about adding prayer to your daily routines, and growing deeper in your prayer lives as we enter into these 40 days. I hope you will consider increasing your generous giving and let your generosity transform you over this penitential season. I hope you will make this journey with us to Holy Week, as we encounter the suffering and death that the Cross has to offer us; always trusting that resurrection is coming.

Lent starts early this year. February 14<sup>th</sup> is Ash Wednesday, and no greater love was ever shown to us on Valentine's Day than the forgiveness God offers us through the ashes we wear humbly. This year, we will have our Lenten worship on Sunday nights at 6:15 (rather than Wednesdays) as we keep the Sabbath day Holy. Meals will be provided prior to worship, like we do every year, and we hope that you will bring your families to the altar, morning and evening, to experience the holy walk of God's people as we journey to Holy Week and Easter.

People of God, prepare your hearts and minds for the great 40 days ahead, humbly wearing your ashes, humbly kneeling at the cross, and humbly repenting from your sins, so that we might stand confidently together, forgiven, chosen, and redeemed Children of God on Easter Day! Amen.

#### Positively Fit: Body, Mind and Soul

Positively Fit meets Monday and Thursday at 5:30 in the assembly room. Variations to exercises are offered!

No Excuses! So, the New Years resolution to exercise has gotten off to a slow start. Maybe the exercises are just too hard, or you don't have the same ability to exercise that you used to have. We all know that there is never enough time in a day to squeeze in a quick workout. So, what else can I do?

Whether you are young or old you can do exercises from your chair. Many of your favorite exercises can be completed from a seated position or standing behind a chair as ballet bar. First, you will want to find a sturdy wooden chair without a cushion for the seat. Usually, a kitchen table chair is perfect for assisting with exercising. Next, make time for at least 10 minutes to start a few exercises. After a few days of exercise, increase your time of exercise.

Web MD tells us that only about 15% of adults between 65 and 75 years of age exercise regularly. Doing exercises with a chair can change that percentage. As our population ages, independence is a prime concern. Regular exercise, even using a chair, can help seniors retain independence as well as help with conditions like diabetes and heart disease - it will make you feel better too!

We all know that exercise has its benefits like strength and flexibility. This can easily be accomplished from a chair. As you engage in chair exercise regularly, you will find that your muscles get stronger and your balance improves. Falling is a huge risk for seniors. Strong core muscles are key for maintaining good balance. Again, core exercises are easy to do from a chair.

Here are some exercises that you can modify and do from a seated position in a chair: Chair jumping jacks, Goalpost jacks, Crunches, Oblique Crunch, Russian Twist, Alternating toe touches, Leg extensions, Cross body punches, Skaters, Heel slides, Calf raises, Chair plank.

Use a set of weights while seated for these exercises: Front raises, lateral raises, Chest press, Biceps curls, Bent over row, Overhead press, Arnold press.

For stability, stand behind a chair and hold on at the top or on the chair seat, then try these exercises: Squats, Single leg squat, Elevated mountain climbers, Inclined pushups, Triceps dips, Glute kick backs. Lateral leg circles

Advanced: Exercises: Bulgarian split squat, Pistol squats, Elevated plank walk, Triceps dip

No Excuses! Here are plenty of exercises to get started at any level of fitness. Make a plan to try a few exercises or to make 10 minutes available to exercise every day. Try to do a few exercises to start and work up until you can do several sets of 8 to 12 repetitions. You can replace those old excuses with accomplishments!




