In the Church's liturgical tradition Ash Wednesday is the traditional beginning of Lent, the season of penitence, reflection and preparation for Holy Week. Our Ash Wednesday observance is solemn – reminding us of our mortality and sinfulness, but also looking ahead to our redemption in the death and resurrection of Christ

This year, we will observe Ash Wednesday with two services, each including Holy Communion and the Imposition of Ashes. The noon service is designed to fit within your lunch hour from work, or you may choose our traditional evening service at 6:15 p.m. A family meal will be served beginning at 5:15 p.m.


Lenten Prayer Beads

If you are not able to participate on this date, we will have other opportunities on Sunday, February 23rd, during the Sunday School hour and during the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper, in the Assembly Room.

2020 Lenten Devotionals

Lenten devotionals, *Renewed by the Water*, will also be available. These devotionals are short essays and include scripture readings and prayers for each day of Lent.

How Beautiful is a guide to fasting on Good Friday. This booklet focuses on a special time of prayer and fasting, using our physical hunger as a symbol of our spiritual hungers. Please be mindful that fasting should be discussed with your doctor prior to participation if you have medical issues.



The Lenten Season is fast approaching. Mt. Tabor, as always, will be providing a meal for the congregation prior to each of the Wednesday evening services during Lent, beginning with Ash Wednesday. Meals will be served at 5:15 pm with the service to follow at 6:15 pm. The Wednesday meals will be: February 26; March 4, 11, 18 & 25; and April 1. A sign-up board will soon be posted in the Assembly Room for any Sunday School class or other church group to *volunteer to prepare a meal*. Although meals will be served at 5:15 pm in the Assembly Room, we would ask that each group preparing a meal have a certain number of meals ready at 4:30 pm on their preparation day so that drivers may pick them up to make deliveries to our members that cannot make it to church.

We may *need drivers to deliver meals* to our at home members on days that meals are served during Lent. Our first meal for delivery will be the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper on February 25. The meal for those in attendance begins at 6:00 pm. Drivers would need to pick up deliveries at 5:30 pm. The Wednesday Lenten meals will be served at 5:15 pm and drivers would need to pick up deliveries at 4:30 pm.


Sunshine Club



From Our Ladies Aid

A longstanding ministry of the Mt. Tabor Ladies Aid has been to provide a funeral meal for the family of deceased members of Mt. Tabor on the day of the funeral. To best accommodate the bereaved family, the members of Mt. Tabor Ladies Aid, and Mt. Tabor members who so generously help us provide the food for the meal, we have prepared the following guidelines to assist families when planning their loved one's funeral service.

Funeral Dinner Guidelines

Funerals scheduled before 2:00

The Ladies Aid will provide a meal **after** the funeral. The meal may be served at the church or packed for the family to take home.

Funerals scheduled at 2:00 or later

The Ladies Aid will provide a meal **before** the funeral. The meal may be served at the church or packed for the family to take home.

Families who do not want a meal

If the family does not want a meal and chooses to have a reception, the Ladies Aid will provide up to 10 cakes and up to 10 gallons of tea. The family/caterer will be responsible for serving and cleaning up afterwards.

A meal may also be offered to a bereaved Mt. Tabor family if the deceased non-member lives in the home of the church member.

UPDATE: HUGS FOR THE HOMELESS-BABY IT'S COLD OUTSIDE!

Since November of 2018, the Mt. Tabor Early Rising Men's group has asked the congregation and community to join with us in providing clothing for those in need, particularly the homeless. In 2018, we initiated a program called HUGS (Hats, Underwear, Gloves and Socks for the Homeless. In 2019, our project Baby it's Cold Outside was set up to buy 100 Coats for the homeless. Here is a recap of what we have accomplished:

- 2018 provided 276 HUGS to clients at Transitions Homeless Center in Columbia.
- 2019 provided 300 HUGS to clients at Transitions Homeless Center in Columbia.
- 2019 provided 120 HUGS, 100 Rain Ponchos to clients at Central Midlands Transitional Retreat in Lexington (Homeless Veterans)
- 2019 provided 100 Hooded Coats and Vests at Central Midlands Transitional Retreat.
- 2019 provided 60 HUGS, 20 rain ponchos, 20 coats to clients at Washington Street UMC Soup Kitchen
- 2019 provided \$500 to buy food for Airport High School Homeless Students.

With Jesus motivating words to provide for "the least of these", God's miraculous blessing, the Holy Spirit's guidance and your sacrificial gifts we have raised \$15,729 and spent \$10,287. We have bought and donated 756 HUGS, 120 coats, 120 rain ponchos and \$500 for food. We will continue to seek out ways to serve "the least of these". And we will continue to meet the second and fourth Tuesday mornings at 7:00 am at Lizards Thicket Oak Grove. Come and join us.
