Council Highlights

Votes Taken:

- Minutes were approved with corrections as noted.
- Council voted to continue with current services and Sunday School for elementary and nursery age children. The motion passed with nine voting for and three opposed.
- Council voted to apply for PPP Loan in 2021 once new applications are being accepted. Motion passed unanimously.
- Council Retreat will be held March 6 with details to come later for time.
- Congregational Meeting has been scheduled for March 21 to approve Yearbook.
- A vote was taken to deposit the Birthday Offering to the General Fund instead of being deposited to the Reserve Fund and was approved unanimously.

Pastoral Ponderings

"Our faith becomes stronger as we express it; a growing faith is a sharing faith." -Billy Graham

People of Mt. Tabor, I hope you have had a wonderful New Year, and a faith filled Epiphany Season. As we draw to the close of Epiphany, we begin preparing ourselves for the Season of Lent with the hope that our lives will grow deep roots of faith and that we will grow closer to God. Because of ongoing COVID restrictions and procedures, this Lenten Season, like the last, will be one, that unfortunately, some of us will experience apart from our congregation. As we enter into this very intentional and reflective season of our Church calendar, we do so hoping that each of you take the time you need to prepare yourselves and those in your family to walk through this Lent. This Lent has the potential, if approached with reverence and purpose, to be the most meaningful Lent that you have ever experienced.

This Lenten Season, you and your family are invited to walk the journey of Lent together, from Ash Wednesday through Holy Week, as we reflect on our lives of faith and walk with each other towards the cross and all it means for us. This Lenten journey gets lived out in three major ways: through prayer, through almsgiving, and through fasting. As you participate in these acts of contrition and repentance, we turn away from our sin and back to God's loving embrace of forgiveness and grace.

This season of Lent will pass us by if we are not intentional about the ways we live our repentance, and we must share our lives of faith with those we love; especially our children. This Lenten season, you are called to a life of devotion and prayer. You are invited to pray alone, but to also challenge yourselves to step outside your comfort zones and pray with someone else, out loud, daily. I know for many Lutherans, that seems too much. But your willingness to try it for 40 days, will open your heart in ways you didn't know possible, and will draw your heart closer to God. Our children need good models of faith and prayer, and you praying with them, as well as for them, will teach them the faith, share with them God's love, and change the way both of you see Jesus in your lives.

Almsgiving is another way to challenge your faith, teach faithful ways of being disciples to our kids, and encourage growth in you as a person, as a church member, and as a disciple of Christ. As members of the Church, there is an expectation that offering will be given on a weekly basis. However, the 40 days of Lent are meant to challenge us to stretch ourselves in our giving and push us to put our hearts in the Lord's hands. I invite you to use Lent as a means to increase your giving to God. Maybe you will increase the amount you give each week, maybe you want to give a lumpsum to a specific ministry within the Church, or maybe you increase the frequency in which you give. Whatever you decide to do, be intentional about it. For the reason behind it is to become more generous people, attuned to the needs of others and God's call for us to love our neighbor.

And lastly, I invite you and your family to pick things, activities, and food in your life and give them up for Lent. Talk about what you are giving up with those you love and share with each other the struggle of not doing those things with each other. Use the sacrifice you are making in these small ways to talk about, think about, and pray about the ways that Christ sacrificed His life for our sin; to save us and redeem us back to God.

Thank you for being open to the season of Lent, and all the ways God is planning on using you to bring about grace and love in this world. You are God's beloved children, with whom God is well pleased. May this Lent be a spiritual time for you to live into that identity. Amen

Faith over Fear was our pondering in January. Isaiah 41:10 tells us: "Fear not for I am with you; Be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and I will help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." We may be fearful of many things in our world now, but we can remember that "Emmanuel" means "God with us." God is with us always so we are never alone. Through the challenges of COVID, social distancing and unrest in our world we are still children of God. One of our hymns that we often sing is "Here I Am, Lord." The first verse says it so well:

*I, the Lord of sea and sky, I have heard my people cry.
All who dwell in dark and sin, my hand will save.
I who made the stars of night, I will make their darkness bright.
Who will bear my light to them? Whom shall I send?*

Our response to God calling us, no matter what the time, is so perfect. We know we are all children of God and he will lead us through all the hills and valleys we travel. So, remembering faith over fear, your response is:

*Here I am Lord, Is it I Lord?
I have heard you calling in the night.
I will go Lord, if You lead me.
I will hold Your people in my heart.*

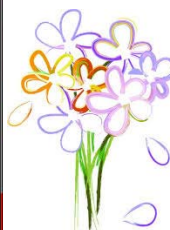

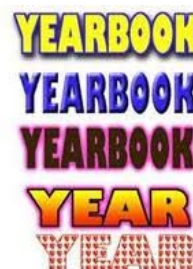

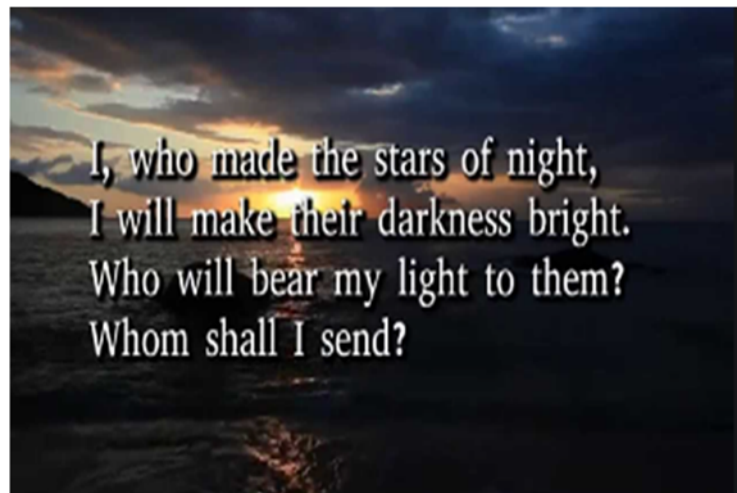
