Council Meeting

The next scheduled Council meeting will be Sunday, January 9th, at 6:00 PM in the Easley Conference Room.



• Minutes were unanimously approved.

• Travis Spainhour gave two quotes to replace the fire alarm panel box system and AC unit computer control system. Our fire alarm panel box control system has been acting up for awhile and is outdated and needs to be upgraded. The computer system for AC controls is outdated and requires upgrade as well. A motion was made to move forward with upgrades in the first quarter of 2023. This year proved we need to keep our fire alarm system working properly. With the third ac unit now replaced in the assembly room the new AC computer system will make 3 of our 4 major AC units run to max efficiency and reliability. The 4 unit, that is the oldest at the church and serves the choir wing and upstairs classrooms. Costs for both upgrades will be \$35,000. We have funds from fire recovery efforts and capital improvements funds to cover the expenses. If we do not replace the fire alarm panel box we are possibly jeopardizing a future Insurance claim or coverage, my opinion. Funds will be taken from Capital Improvements. The motion passed unanimously.

- Whitney Glass made a motion to distribute Christmas Bonuses to staff. This was unanimously approved.

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

~Pastor Wade -January 2023

"Now, discipline always seems painful rather than pleasant at the time, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it." Hebrews 12:11

As many of you are making your New Year's Resolutions, I urge you to do so with great discipline; going over your life with a fine-toothed-comb, and looking for ways and places to rid yourselves of the debris that separates you from God, and you from one another. And then to act on them in ways that bring peace into your lives, peace into your families, and peace into the world through the ways you become new once again.

While the idea of newness is scary, it's also refreshing to know that God also is doing something new with us. Always renewing us, always forgiving us, always drawing closer to us, and always using us to bring the Kingdom of Heaven into focus. One way God used our dreary world once again to bring God's Word of love and grace to millions of people, was through a "Technology Reformation" within the Church – even with-in Mt Tabor! Video cameras, audio and sound equipment, iPads and wi-fi, and many other means of communication have been thrust upon us, and we have done our best to adjust and move with extenuating circumstances to continue to communicate Word and Sacrament to God's people. While this technology was raw at the beginning of COVID, it has boomed over the last two years, and we have had a lot to learn just to keep up.

And while a lot of that learning was about what to use and how to use it, we have also learned a lot about who WE ARE along the way. We have learned that we are a people that need more than just online worship; that we need fellowship and togetherness to thrive. We have learned that God can and does work through the airways, and is present with us even when were not present with each other. And we have learned that our worship and touch goes, literally around the world as people near and far tune in to what we are doing in this place and that this technology is here to stay. God is doing something new!

While I doubt, we will every fully figure it all out, we will keep trying. Just recently, we purchased new cameras for our worship space, and our videographers are hard at work trying to find the best place to place them, how to work them efficiently, and how to use them for God's glory and God's kingdom. This takes time and energy, and seems like an ongoing experiment. We ask for your patience and that you would bear with us through this process. While we know this can seem distracting when you are in person, I have heard the stories from person after person that continues to stay connected to us when they cannot be here, and for them, it's worth every bit of work on our end.

I try to look at our worship on Sundays as, not only our time with God, but also a gift that we get to give others as they tune in from wherever they might be that day. They hear our singing, they feel our prayers, and they get caught up in our use of the means of grace, and they too are moved to sing, pray, and connect to the grace and love that God pours upon them as well.

Please bear with us in our troubleshooting, please endure our moving stands around, please accept these devices inside the worship space, and please help carry the weight of our worship to the masses that join us virtually. Your participation shares the very love of God with all those people need to hear this life saving Word today. God is continuing to do what God has always done, as God does something new with us! Amen.

ALIVE NEWS!

We continue our article series to help everyone get to know our ALIVE musicians. Hope you enjoy getting to know Beth this month!

My name is Beth Branham and I am a member of the Alive! Group. I have been a member of Mt. Tabor over 20 years since bringing my three young children here to be members of this community church with a strong youth program. I grew up at Transfiguration Lutheran where my mother, Mollie DuPriest Taylor, was a child charter member after her parents (Earl and Lib DuPriest) transferred from Mt. Tabor to help start that new church.

I am blessed to sing and worship every Sunday and practice every Tuesday with my three children and my Alive! family. We are a family, this Alive! Group; but we are also part of the family of worshippers who join us every Sunday, and a part of an even bigger Mt. Tabor family.

We all know that as children/young adults age, they reach a time period in their lives where they grow further from the church. This is often a time they need God and the church the most. Particularly during the initial COVID shut-downs, it became fairly easy to "log in" to church and worship and then eventually not even do that for so many of us, myself included.

My children were called during COVID shutdowns by their Mt. Tabor childhood choir director, Ms. Gale McLeod, to come and share their talents and help step up, lead, and grow our church. They answered the call and joined a "cast of characters" like Roxanne Livingston Rich, Erin Hall, Vaughn Hall, Ricky Lusk, Ed Redmond, David Moye, Leah Conrad, and Ricky's grandson, among others, who had been there since the beginning with Irelou Moye and Gale. Then as I sat on that couch watching Church happen, the Spirit called to me and asked why I was not setting the example; why were my children setting the example for me of what true Christians and church leaders do in times of pandemic and fear and crisis – they quietly step up and lead.

I am a traditional Lutheran. I love the standing up and sitting down and the liturgy and all that. But, I also recognize that if we, as a church, are going to grow, we have to expand our worship offerings. I think this service is misunderstood by people who have not attended it. This is not a "rock band" service. It is beautiful hymns, anthems, and camp songs accompanied by a variety of instruments and voices worshipping our Lord as we are called to do in Psalm 150, verse 4: "Praise Him with tambourine and dance; praise him with strings and pipe!"

Practices, set up, service, and rehearsal generally require a minimum of about 5 hours per week for the musicians in this service. We are volunteers who may have school or jobs or young children and other distractions of this world; but we come to prepare each week and we worship with our hearts, minds, instruments, and voices because we all love this church and want to see it grow.

As we look to this new way to worship, I am reminded of my grandparents Earl and Lib DuPriest who, nearly 70 years ago, left Mt. Tabor with their three small children to help begin Transfiguration Lutheran and how I returned about 50 years later with three small children in tow to find a Lutheran church family with a strong youth program. I then think about present day and how my children and I are now blessed to help the other Alive musicians grow a different type of service that we hope will draw young families and young adults to our church.

To that end, I invite each of you to give us a try! Try coming to a practice and playing your instrument; try coming and singing a few songs with us; or try to wake up a little early (if you are an 11:00 person) or sleep a little late (if you are more the 8:00 type) and come worship with us and be part of our 9:15 Alive! Family.




