As the Strategic Planning Committee continues to work through the survey results that many of you participated in last fall, a few characteristics have surfaced that are key to our identity as Mt Tabor Lutheran Church. These traits arose clearly through your answers, and they did NOT surprise the committee at all. In fact, we were happy to see some of these responses rise up and connect with so many of you. In the coming months, you will hear about the committee's work and all that went into it, but the one aspect of your answers I want report to you about today is the idea that Mt Tabor Lutheran Church sees itself as FAMILY!

This idea shouldn't surprise many of you: that this congregation sees itself as family. Too many cookies this holiday season? If your waistband seems a little snug, you may have considered a few extra crunches or sit-ups. The fact is that you cannot just do extra ab exercises to correct this situation! In order to lose the belly fat, you must lose the pounds that you added on. The extra crunches won't hurt though!

Losing weight will help to shrink your waistline and rid your body of the bad visceral fat. This is the fat that is carried in the abdominal cavity that you don't see but it poses many health risks. Research conducted at Johns Hopkins found that a low-carb diet produced better weight loss results than a low-fat diet. This combined with exercise can bring you right back to having comfortable clothing.

There are many diet plans that offer low carb meals and recipes. Find one that works with your schedule and meals. Many of the plans will eliminate sugars and refined flours. Vegetables are a must but look for the veggies that grow above the ground. Vegetables that we harvest below the ground are starch storage containers for the plant. Green, leafy veggies are the lowest in carbs. Lean meats and vegetables will get you to your goal. Stay away from processed foods and eat clean.

If you are already exercising, (which I hope you are with the help of these articles) continue your exercise routines. If not, start moving! Add an extra walk or increase the time of your walks to ramp up the burn. You can include free weights if you don't already use weights or increase the amount of weight where it feels comfortable.

If you feel you need, add some extra ab exercises just to tone and tighten. You can try a few extra crunches or sit-ups, but you might want to try some new exercises. Here are a few to get you started!

Tabletop crunch — lay on your back, knees up at a 90-degree angle. Hold knees in this position. Roll up into a crunch or place hands on your knees and press your hands into your knees as you lift your shoulders off the floor.

Leg Circles — you can do this double leg or single leg. Lay on your back and make big circles with your straight legs.

Runners Sit Up - lay on your back and bring a single knee up to meet your opposite elbow.

Spiderman Planks - in the plank position, bring your knee into the elbow on the same side.

Side Plank Crunch - in the side plank position bring your knee to meet your elbow on that side.

Plank Reach out - in the plank position, alternate reaching your arm out straight ahead.

Wood choppers - standing, hold hands together and make a "slashing motion" from above your shoulder, across your body, over to the opposite hip. Switch sides and repeat in the opposite direction.

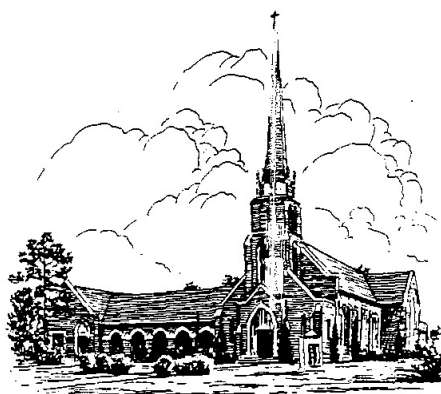
