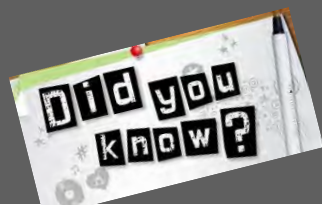

Council Meeting

The next scheduled Council meeting will be Sunday, July 11, at 6:00 PM in the Easley Conference Room.

Council Highlights

- ◆ A congregational vote was taken on Sunday, June 13, to move forward with the Call Committee process for the position of Associate Pastor. It passed with 69% voting yes. Bishop Ginny Aebischer will meet with Travis Spainhour and Pastor Wade to discuss this process. Then we will need to form a Call Committee.
- ◆ The minutes of the previous meeting were unanimously approved after a correction was made to the motion to change wording on Motion #3 to "Salary has been approved for \$70-75,000 as recommended by the Finance Committee."
- ◆ Council unanimously approved the optional choice of members to wear or not wear a face mask.
- ◆ Our Easter offering goal of \$25,000 has been exceeded. The total is \$26,928.65. 10% will go to outreach ministries, 45% to maintenance and 45% to salaried positions.
- ◆ A vote was taken to approve coffee being served between services. The motion passed unanimously. No food will be served at this time. We also agreed to refer the idea of resuming breakfast to the Covid Task Force for their review & recommendations. We will wait until July's Council Meeting to discuss serving breakfast.

Pastoral Ponderings

"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." ~John 13:34-45

There is a great picture on Facebook of Jesus preaching to a large group of people and the above Bible verse is what He is preaching in that moment. Then, as you scan down the page, you see text bubbles coming from the people in the crowd asking the, "But what if," questions. "But what if they're (insert the opposite political party)" or "But what if they pull for (Carolina or Clemson)" or "But what if they (are/aren't) still wearing a mask?" At the bottom of the picture, Jesus' text bubble says, "Did I stutter?"

It's funny in the way that we do this all the time. We know the scriptures that call us, even command us, to love one another, and we still find it hard, even impossible, to bring ourselves to a place where love can happen easily with someone who thinks, acts, and lives differently than we do. Yet, Jesus doesn't stutter or beat around the bush when it comes to this commandment. "Love one another." Especially when it's not easy. Especially when we disagree. Especially when there is something on the horizon that threatens to divide us.

As our congregation and community of faith continues to open up more and more, as we welcome more and more people back to worship, Sunday School, and fellowship activities, and as we continue to relax the last year's pandemic protocols, we do so trusting that each person will make the best decisions for themselves about their levels of comfort and their personal health circumstances.

So, in the coming weeks and months, you will most likely see some people wearing masks in worship and some not, some people hugging and standing closely and some staying 6ft or more away, some will get vaccinated and some will not, and some will begin coming back to worship, while others are not quite ready. This might be the hardest test we've had during the pandemic, as so many are divided on the subject, so many have different levels of comfort, and so many are making different decisions for a myriad of different reasons... the bottom line is that we are called to love each other through this.

The temptation will continue to be of some time, a desire for others to see this situation the way you do. They won't. The temptation will be for a debate on the effectiveness of different measures taken. That's not helpful. The temptation will be to exclude or to not move forward. This is not the way to be the Church God is calling us to be.

The only way we can truly be the Church God is calling us to be is by loving our neighbor, giving them and ourselves space to make the best decisions we can for ourselves as well as the larger community, and being patient with each other as we figure out how to live together again. Remember, *"Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends."*

This is how we will be the Church moving forward, this is how we will continue to be the community of faith that each of us needs to live in this world, and this is how we can be Jesus to one another. People of God, be patient with each other, and don't judge each other for the decisions that are being made. For we all need space and grace to live in this world. So, love one another as Jesus loves you. Amen

Handbell Ringers Needed!

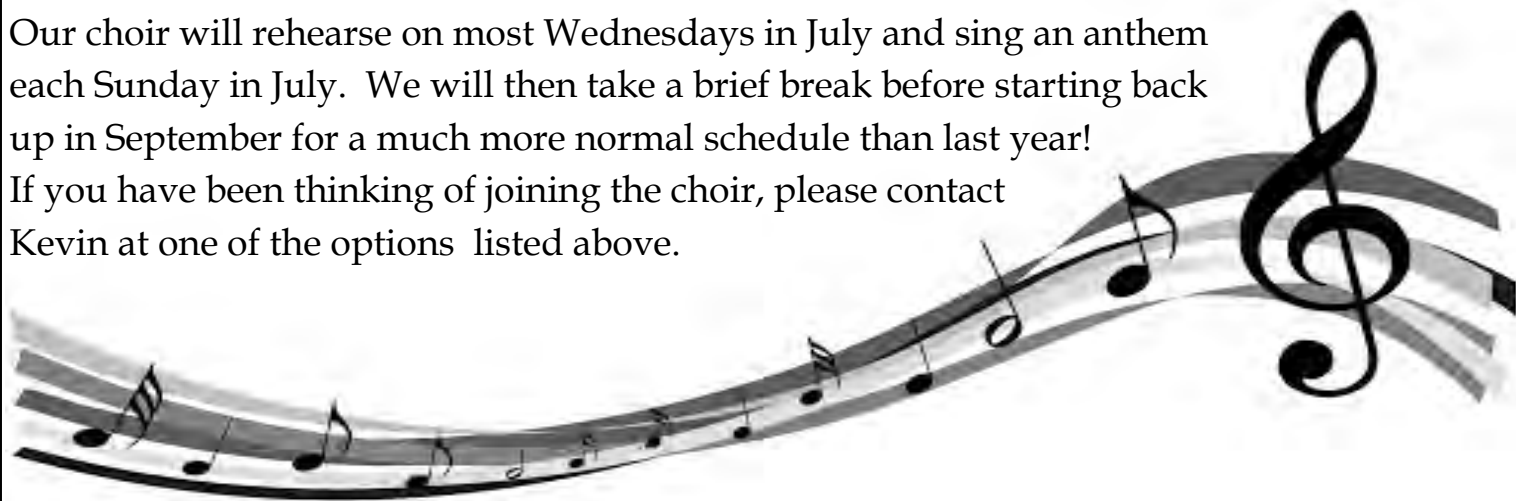

Hello! I hope everyone's summer is off to a great start! In between the rain, there is sunshine that most of us take advantage of with various outdoor activities. With this in mind, your Faith Community Health Ministry focused, in June, on caring for the largest organ of the body - the skin. This organ is one of the most taken for granted organs of our body. I hope you found some helpful information in what we provided for you - ways in which you can care for and love your skin to keep it healthy and glowing not only during the summer months but year-round.

Wednesday, June 21st was the first day of Mt. Tabor's participation in the Summer Feeding Program for Lex2. Each Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday, we will be distributing food provided by the school district to children 18 years of age and younger. Children do not need to live in Lexington County, nor do they need to be enrolled in school. Parents and other caregivers may pick food up with or without their children present.

We would like to include coloring pages/books and crayons or other age-appropriate crafts in the bags of food we distribute to give these mostly disadvantaged children activities to do during the summer months. We were recently awarded a grant from The Evangelical Lutheran Parish Nurses Association to aid in furthering the development of our program here at Mt. Tabor. As part of that development, we continue our search for a volunteer Faith Community/Parish Nurse for Mt. Tabor. This is a volunteer position which we hope will become a paid position in the future. If you or someone you know would like to volunteer 5-10 hours a week to this rewarding position, please contact Vicar Gayle or BJ Roof.
