<sup>24</sup>Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. <sup>25</sup>Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever. <sup>26</sup>Therefore I do not run like someone running aimlessly; I do not fight like a boxer beating the air. <sup>27</sup>No, I strike a blow to my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified for the prize.

-1 Corinthians 9:24-27

We are working on our third month of living under the fear of the Coronavirus. It seems that our patience is growing thin, we are getting tired of living this way. I miss the hugs, I miss the handshakes, I miss the personal connection. We still have our social media platforms like Facebook, Youtube, Instagram, and Zoom, but it still feels like something is missing. I find myself looking to obtain more patience just for another couple weeks until we can be together for worship again. This patience requires discipline on our part. I find myself thinking, "If only I had more discipline, this process would be easier."

Is that the proper definition of discipline? Is discipline something that we have that makes our life easier? I do not think I have it right. I think Paul's definition in his letter to the Corinthians could help shine some light on our definition of discipline. I like the part when he mentions that we need to make our bodies a slave. What a violent way to depict the subjection of our mind over our bodies. Paul is calling us to work hard and actively train ourselves. Discipline is not a thing we obtain, it is something we are actively struggling with. When we have discipline, we are constantly working hard to push through a situation or improve ourselves. Kent Hughes, an author of many books relating discipline to God, defines discipline as "spiritual sweat." So if we define discipline as a 'spiritual sweat,' we find that it is something uncomfortable that consistently challenges us. Discipline enables us to wake up extra early so that we may find time to read the Bible. Discipline inspires us to work out when we get home from work when we feel like we have no more energy in us.

So the answer is yes. That is exactly what we need in a situation like this. We need that discomfort to get us across the finish line when we will all come together again. Living through the Coronavirus is not easy, so we need some of that spiritual sweat to challenge us to live out these last couple of weeks when we will finally worship as one community again. Then we can once again come together as "one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all" (Ephesians 4).

While we are apart for what we hope is only a little longer, no matter what happens, we are the church. We have all stepped up during this time to help one another and take care of so many things. We have healthcare workers and first responders who are on the front lines every day. But, what about those of us who are not on the front lines? We have been there to take care of so many others. We have called each other, sent cards, worshiped online together, picked up things at the store for our neighbors and the list could go on and on. Most of all, we have not forgotten that through all of this time, we are God's children. We have prayed together in ways that we might not have imagined just 6 months ago.

We have been good stewards to God and to one another. We have been the hands and feet of Jesus in this crazy time. And in a world where we can be anything, we are kind. We share God's love with one another and we will continue to do that as we learn to adapt back into our lives and coming together again. Isaiah 43:1 reminds us "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name; You are mine."

#### **Phased Return To In-Person Church Activities**

"Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love."

Joel 2:13

Beloved People of God,

Today it is with joy and excitement that I write to you about our plans to return to "in-person Church Activities." While we cannot know or anticipate every detail of our return back together, we are putting in place a phased return, and what we believe will be helpful guidelines, to begin coming back together as a congregation.

First and foremost, before I get into our phased plans, I would ask that you be in prayer for your pastoral staff, your Council leadership, and your fellow congregational members. Every one of us has an opinion about how this should happen, and each person has to decide how they will personally engage with this plan. While some people will be very conservative and slow in how they deal with returning to church, work, and society, others will want to move faster and hurry the process along. This is our chance to practice grace and love with each other, and to give each person enough space (literally and figuratively) to ease back into worship, as they are comfortable. This is not a time to judge each other, but a time to lift each other up for the building up of the body of Christ.

Everything outlined in the phases below is subject to change as the Church leadership continues to monitor and adjust to the state of this pandemic and to the health and safety of our congregation. These protocols, unless otherwise specified, will stay in place until further notice.

#### **GENERAL PROTOCOLS**

- The Church office and buildings will be cleaned and sanitized on Mondays and Fridays. This process will happen more often as the need for cleaning and sanitizing increases.
- 11:00 Online Sunday Worship will continue for any and every one who wishes to stay home. Facebook Live, YouTube, and our DVD ministry will continue for anyone who does not want to participate in-person. The full worship service will be offered online, along with Holy Communion on the first Sunday of every month.
- Any and all gatherings of people at Mt. Tabor Lutheran Church will be required to observe Social Distancing protocols of at least six feet. Immediate families may sit together.
- We strongly recommend each person on campus wear a mask that covers both your nose and mouth. As of now, we ask that each person bring their own. Please wear your mask at all times while on the Church campus; this includes, but is not limited to, wearing your mask while we sing and worship.
- Please avoid lingering, especially inside, but also outside too. How you gather off campus is your prerogative, but while on campus, we ask that you sit with your immediate family only (spouses and children) and as soon as worship is over, return to your cars without contact of other people or families. Please maintain social distance.
- VBS is canceled for the summer of 2020.
- Sunday School is suspended for the months of June and July.
- No committee meetings or group meetings will happen on Mt. Tabor's campus in June or July.
- No coffee, food, or refreshments will be served during June or July.
- The sharing of the peace will only be done by waving to one another. Please do not offer or accept a handshake or other physical contact.
- Bathrooms will be available for emergency use only. Please see ushers for access.
- The kitchen, nursery, and all other sections of the facilities are closed to the public during the months of June and July.
- Council reserves the right to change or amend any and all of these dates and our scheduled return.

#### PHASE I (June 1 – June 30)

- In-person worship will begin on Sunday, June 7, at 9:00 am.
- In-person worship will happen outside as weather permits.
- In-person worship will be canceled for inclement weather. (It will not be moved inside.)
- In-person worship will not have Holy Communion during June. You may join with us online on June 7 for "Online Communion."
- Anyone who falls into the high-risk categories according to the CDC, or anyone who is caring for someone who is in the high-risk categories, are highly recommended to stay home and worship through online means. This includes, but is not limited to, senior citizens and those with existing health conditions.
- Masks are strongly recommended even for outdoor worship, especially while singing.
- There will be limited singing and a shortened worship format for the month of June.
- Sunday School, Music and Drama Camp, and all other committee and group meetings on campus have been canceled for the month of June.

#### PHASE II (July 1 – July 31)

- In-person worship will be moved indoors.
- Three or more worship services will be offered to reduce the number of people in each space. Service times will be 8:00 am, 9:30 am, and 11:00 am.
- Wednesday Noon Worship will be offered for any senior citizens only. Social distancing is required and masks are strongly recommended. This service is so that our senior citizens will have a specific service they can come to so that they may avoid the larger crowds and mitigate their risk of infection.
- The sanctuary will be cleaned between each worship service to mitigate the risk of others coming in contact with COVID-19.
- No more than 50 people will be allowed at each worship service. Members of Mt. Tabor will RSVP during the week prior to attending worship.
- Anyone who falls into the high-risk categories according to the CDC is highly recommended to stay home and worship through online means. This includes, but is not limited to, senior citizens and those with existing health conditions.
- Masks are strongly recommended for everyone on the Church campus, especially while we sing and worship.
- VBS, Sunday School, and all other committee and group meetings on campus have been canceled for the month of July.

#### PHASE III (August 1 – August 31)

• Hopefully the pandemic has tapered off enough to relax our guidelines and protocols and we can return to "normal Church Activity."

This is all best case scenario, and we will adjust these plans as it best suits the safety and health of our congregation. Further communication about Church activities will come as we get closer to June 7<sup>th</sup>. Please know we have you in our prayers and cannot wait to see you in person.

#### "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice." Phil 4:4

It is with great joy and pleasure I write to you about some of the exciting things going on at Mt. Tabor since you have been home in quarantine. So often lately, it feels like we have been stifled, but today I proclaim to you that the Holy Spirit is alive and well at MTLC, and calling us to some incredible things.

- Your Council Leadership is Awesome!
  - In the face of a worldwide pandemic, your church Council leadership has risen to the challenge. People of God, I want you to know that those you elected to lead your church have been working hard to make sure that this place continues to be God's light during this dark time. Much discernment, countless prayers, and many hours have gone into listening to God's Spirit, and addressing the issues facing us right now. Thank you to everyone on council for being so flexible and trying hard to meet the demands of this difficult time head on.
- Your Online Worship Team is Amazing!
  - While online worship is not ideal, the people of Mt. Tabor have stepped up in amazing ways to make sure God's Word is proclaimed and that we offer quality worship for God's people.
  - Elise Helms, Sandra Lindler, Max Witherell, Olivia Witherell, Erin Hall, Karen Shevenell, Isaac Shevenell, Pam Hoskins, Paul Jacobs, Kendrick Kerr, Vicar Justin Marx, and Pastor Emily Willhide. These people have worked tirelessly to plan, adjust, and carry out worship on a weekly basis. I am very proud of the work they have done as well as the worship that we have put out to help our people connect with God during this difficult time.
- God's People are Responding, and Meeting Christ in New and Incredible ways!
  - You would not believe how many people are worshiping with us online! During our weekday morning devotions we are seeing between 800 to 1000 devices connecting and joining us for Morning Prayer. During Evening Devotions we are connecting with 500 to 700 individual devices. And Sunday Morning Worship averages between 1500 to 2000 separate devices. We assume an average device has 2-3 people on each one, which makes this an incredible evangelism tool for spreading and proclaiming God's Word to God's people.
- The Church Office Staff have been a Godsend to our Congregation!
  - I want to send out a very special thank you to Niki Crolley and Stella McGee. Without their help and willingness to
    go above and beyond the call of duty, our congregation would not be where it is today. Please take time to thank them
    for their hard work and dedication to Mt. Tabor during the 2020 pandemic.
- The Music Director's Search Committee is Hard at Work!
  - While this process is not over, the search committee for the Director of Music has put in some long hours discerning God's will and direction to fill this position. There have been a lot of very qualified candidates who have applied, many hours of interviews, and more time in prayer than anyone of us could have imagined. As we are getting close to finding our next Director of Music, I ask that Mt. Tabor lift up our congregation, our search committee, and the final candidates in your prayers and ask that God bless us with the right person to join us in our faith journey. We're in the final stages of this process and we look forward to celebrating the person God will bring us.
  - A heartfelt and deep thank you goes out to our Search Committee: Nancy Stone-Collum (Chair); Jimmy Williams (W&M Committee and Council Rep); Elise Helms; Irelou Moye; Nick Skorzewski; Leah Conrad; and Justin Marx. Thank you for your faithful service.
- New Worship Opportunities!
  - As we plan our phases of returning to in-person worship, we do so carefully discerning God's path for us to walk back together. Tentatively, as of July, we will be offering at least three worship services that you can attend. Service times will be 8:00, 9:30, and 11:00, and will spread out the congregation to allow for social distancing. With an increase of worship services, several of our very talented members of Mt. Tabor have offered their gifts to help lead worship musically. We are looking forward to those volunteers leading us as we come back together. Please discern which worship time is best for you. See letter titled Phased Return to In-Person Worship (p.4/5) for more information.
- South Carolina Synod Assembly
  - On July 25, 2020 the SC Synod Assembly will be held at St. Stephen's Lutheran Church in Lexington, SC for the purpose of electing a new Bishop. Please be in prayer for our Synod and for the person God has set apart for this position.


