PASTORAL PONDERINGS

“When the day of Pentecost had come, the Disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit...” Acts 2:1-4

After a quick Google search of the word “Fire” in scripture, apart from only a few places that speak about the unquenchable fires of hell, every other place in scripture talks about fire as evidence of God’s presence in this world. For example: the burning bush, the pillar of fire that led the Israelites, John’s prophesying a baptism of the Holy Spirit and fire, and the Pentecost moment where tongues of fire rest upon the disciples’ heads, just to name a few. In every other example of fire in scripture, God is creating, renewing, leading, and cleansing God’s people for something exciting and special.

What happened here with the fire on April 29 around 1:00 in the afternoon, felt anything but cleansing and renewing, and yet at the same time, God was here. Destruction and chaos might have started from those flames, but the reality is that God was doing some miraculous things that day that need to be celebrated and lifted up.

First, I cannot thank George Crowe, our church sexton, enough for his presence here at the church and for his quick actions that saved a large part of the church from any more damage than we experienced. George not only found the fire, moved to get the people in the church buildings out to safety, but also helped coordinate the first responders that showed up on scene.

I want to thank the church staff for their presence at the church that day as well. As the fire burned hot, these men and women worked efficiently and effectively to get the people and things in place so that recovery and restoration could begin immediately.

We would not be here today if it were not for the first responders that showed up from the West Columbia Fire Department. To watch these men and women run toward the flames, toward the danger, and towards the problem rather than running away, was nothing short of the brave and inspiring.

I would also like to say a huge thank you to Livingston Insurance, Cincinnati Insurance (our underwriters) and Rainbow Cleaners. Each of these companies have looked out for us, have treated us with love and respect, and are a major part of us getting things back in order in this place.

All of that is to say that through this fire and its aftermath, God has most definitely been present; renewing us, and reshaping us to be new creations in Christ. God has been faithful in the cleanup process. God will be here in the rebuilding and reorganizing, and God will be here as we reopen and move forward in the months ahead. But most of all, we have seen God in each one of you!

Thank you for your patience. Thank you for your love and support. Thank you for your flexibility and your ability and willingness to adjust. And thank you for your help in making this place a wonderful church of grace as a witness to the fire that is the Holy Spirit who dwells here with us. The fire may have stalled some things for now, but the fire has also revealed God’s presence and blessing in and through His Church. We are Mt. Tabor Strong! Amen

Music for Pentecost

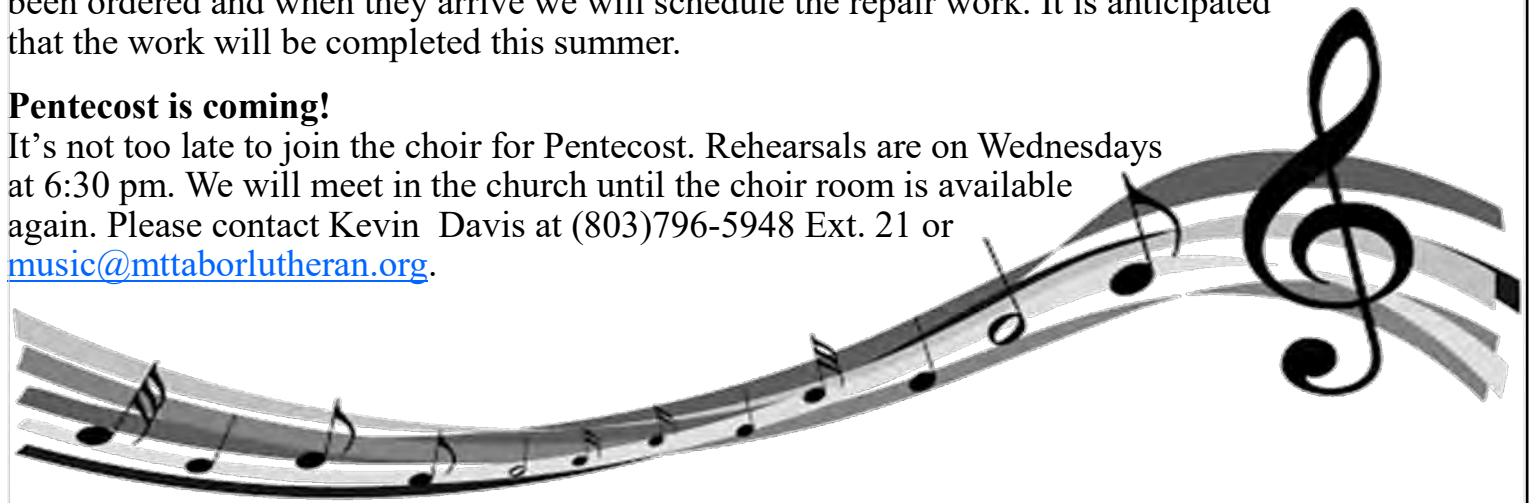

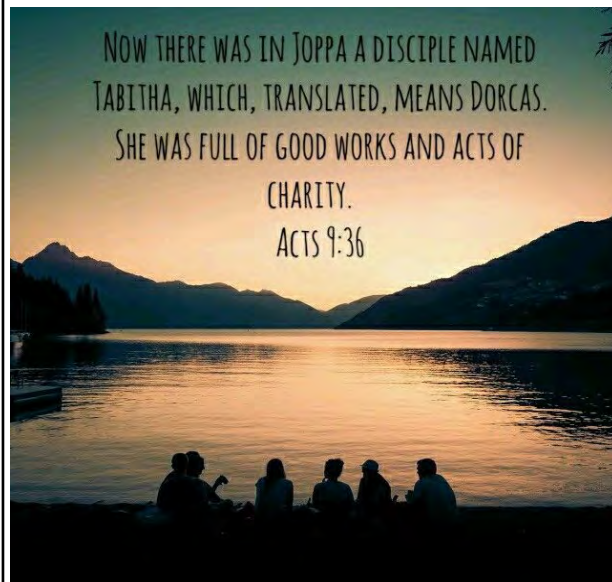
