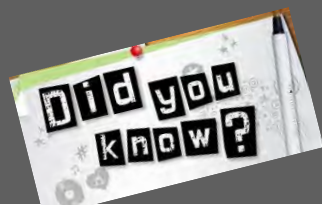

- ◆ A motion was made to allow Tristan Spainhour to build, as his Eagle Scout Project, a GaGa Ball Pit in the Mt. Tabor Park. The motion was passed unanimously.
- ◆ Vicar Gayle Nelson presented a motion for Mt. Tabor to become a location for handouts for summer meals for school children who are on low income. The motion passed unanimously.
- ◆ Vicar Gayle Nelson asked Mt. Tabor to begin a process to find a Faith Ministry Nurse (Parish Nurse) on a volunteer basis to work from 5-10 hours a week. A motion was made and passed unanimously.
- ◆ The next Council Meeting has been changed to Sunday, May 2, 2021 at 6:00 PM.

Kevin Davis joins Mt. Tabor as Music Director in May. He has most recently been Organist/Chorimaster of Calvary Episcopal Church in Summit, NJ where he directed the Adult Choir, Calvary Chorale, Handbell Choir and Choristers. He holds a Master of Music degree in Organ Performance and Church Music (Choral Conducting) from Westminster Choir College where he studied organ with Joan Lippincott and choral conducting with Constantina Tsolainou, Allan Crowell, and Frauke Haasemann. He earned his Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Organ Performance at Louisiana Tech University, where he studied organ with Ray Bradbury and was active in Concert Choir, Tech Chorale, Symphonic Band, Marching Band, Opera Workshop, Musical Theatre, and Orchestra.

In addition to directing Adult Choirs, RSCM Choristers and Handbells in several churches; Kevin Davis has directed Concord Singers (Summit, NJ), Bella Voce (Premier Women's Chorus of Mobile (AL), St. Paul's Choral Society (AL), St. Paul's Schola Cantorum (AL), Rutland Area Chorus (VT) and Voices of Vermont. He has also been the guest conductor of regional honors choirs in Vermont and New York. As an organ recitalist, he has performed in Alabama, Louisiana, Texas, Vermont, New Hampshire, New Jersey, Maine and Rhode Island; and he has been featured as flutist with the Westminster Handbell Choir on the Gothic Label.

Kevin is an active member of the American Guild of Organists, Association of Anglican Musicians, American Choral Directors Association and American Guild of English Handbell Ringers.

Kevin moves to Columbia with his husband, Jeff Clearman, who will serve as organist and choir director at St. James' Lutheran in Lexington. They have a daughter, Allison, and a grandson, Cooper, and another grandson on the way. They also have a cat, Midnight. Kevin loves cooking and gardening.

Trying to tell the difference between what expected behaviors are and what might be the signs of a mental illness isn't always easy. There's no easy test that can let someone know if there is mental illness or if actions and thoughts might be typical behaviors of a person or the result of a physical illness.

Each illness has its own symptoms, but common signs of mental illness in adults and adolescents can include the following:

- Excessive worrying or fear
- Feeling excessively sad or low
- Confused thinking or problems concentrating and learning
- Extreme mood changes, including uncontrollable “highs” or feelings of euphoria
- Prolonged or strong feelings of irritability or anger
- Avoiding friends and social activities
- Difficulties understanding or relating to other people
- Changes in sleeping habits or feeling tired and low energy
- Changes in eating habits such as increased hunger or lack of appetite
- Changes in sex drive
- Difficulty perceiving reality (delusions or hallucinations, in which a person experiences and senses things that don't exist in objective reality)
- Inability to perceive changes in one's own feelings, behavior or personality (“lack of insight” or anosognosia)
- Overuse of substances like alcohol or drugs
- Multiple physical ailments without obvious causes (such as headaches, stomach aches, vague and ongoing “aches and pains”)
- Thinking about suicide
- Inability to carry out daily activities or handle daily problems and stress
- An intense fear of weight gain or concern with appearance

Mental health conditions can also begin to develop in young children. Because they're still learning how to identify and talk about thoughts and emotions, their most obvious symptoms are behavioral. Symptoms in children may include the following:

- Changes in school performance
- Excessive worry or anxiety, for instance fighting to avoid bed or school
- Hyperactive behavior
- Frequent nightmares
- Frequent disobedience or aggression
- Frequent temper tantrums

## Where To Get Help

Don't be afraid to reach out if you or someone you know needs help. Learning all you can about mental health is an important first step. Reach out to your health insurance, primary care doctor or state/county mental health authority for more resources.
