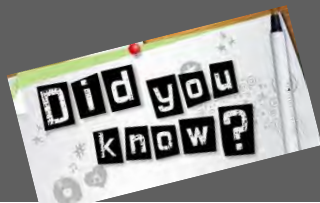

Nothing to report for April's meeting.

FROM OUR VICAR

Acts 5: 27-32

When they had brought [the apostles], they had them stand before the council. The high priest questioned them, saying, "We gave you strict orders not to teach in this name, yet here you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching, and you are determined to bring this man's blood on us." But Peter and the apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than any human authority. The God of our ancestors raised up Jesus, whom you had killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Savior that he might give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him."

I hope this reflection meets you amidst Easter joy, and draws you out of your comfort zone. The risen Christ calls the Church—all of us—into a faith that pushes us into the uncomfortable and seems to constantly be talking about blood.

During Holy Week, we hear of Jesus holding up a cup and proclaiming it to be his own blood, “shed for you and for all people.” We then proclaim the story of Jesus dying on a cross, blood shed out of faithful love for the people of the world. Now, at the beginning of the Easter season, we hear about Peter and the apostles having to endure persecution—because they are determined to bring Jesus’ blood upon the people of the world.

We are called to follow in Christ’s footsteps. Because Jesus loved us to the point of self-sacrifice, we love the world in a similar fashion. Faithful Christianity is, and always has been, uncomfortable. It is self-sacrificial, pushing us out of what is easy toward what is faithful. For me, blood donation has always been a sacrificial spiritual practice. It’s how I spent the Tuesday afternoon following Easter Sunday, at the Red Cross on Bull Street.

If you’ve never given a blood donation, let me assure you: it’s uncomfortable. The building is dreary, and they ask you a litany of uncomfortable questions. They ask about your history with intimate partners, followed by very pointed questions about your health, and then bluntly inquire about your history with drugs. Then, you’re stabbed with a large needle, and prompted to squeeze and relax your hand for about the next 20 minutes. With each squeeze, blood flows out of our arm, and into the collection bag through a plastic tube.

I have never enjoyed it. I don’t do it because it’s fun, or because I’m trying to earn God’s love—the blood of Jesus is sufficient for my salvation. Throughout my adult life, I have donated a gallon-and-a-half of blood, in response to the blood that Jesus first shed for us. I continue to donate blood, because we must carry on the tradition of being the Church, following in Paul’s footsteps.

During Lent, our congregation donated 18 units of blood from the blood drive in our assembly room. If you were one of those donors, you’ll be eligible again before the end of May. As we walk together into this Easter season, let us accompany one another into a faith that is uncomfortable. Let us together, emulate self-sacrifice and unconditional love, because God first loved us.
