





Positivity Fit: Body, Mind and Soul

So, the temperatures are scorching and you don't want to exercise, what should you do? Exercise of course! You can choose exercises that are easy to do inside. If you just can't get a workout in unless you are outside, use common sense when the temps are steaming! Refer to the July article to refresh your memory on the effects of heat on the body to avoid heat exhaustion and heat stroke.

If you exercise outside, your body will tell you when it is too hot! Listen to your body but also prepare your body before you exercise outside.

Always avoid the hottest part of the day. The hours between 10-4 should be avoided because of the direct rays of the sun. Try to exercise early in the morning or late in the afternoon. However, the humidity can also play a role in your body temperature. High humidity does not allow your body to evaporate sweat preventing your body to cool itself.

Hydrate before going outside even if you are not working out! Remember to drink plenty of fluids and eat fruits and vegetables that contain water. Take water or sport drinks outside with you when gardening or exercising. Sport drinks can be a good option because they taste good and you will want to drink more. If you are replenishing your body with a sport drink, choose one that is low in sugar with electrolytes.

The sun's rays can damage your skin anytime of the day. Always wear sunscreen when you are outdoors. Choose products that are at least 30 SPF and are broad-spectrum to block the damaging rays. Reapply according to directions or no more than every 2 hours.

Wear clothing that will help your body stay cool. Choose light weight clothing that does not fit tight to allow for ventilation. Light colors and white will help to reflect the sun's rays and not soak up the heat. Some fabrics can help with cooling by absorbing sweat and allowing for evaporation. If you are in the sun, you may want a hat to block the sun from your face, but a hat does not necessarily keep you cooler since some of your heat escapes from your head.

Alter your workout plan. Shorter workouts and/or longer recovery periods can ease the stress on your body from the heat.

Always listen to your body! If you are feeling overheated, get to the shade, drink fluids and

take a break!


