Council Meeting

The next scheduled Council meeting will be Sunday, October 10th, at 6:00 PM in the Easley Conference Room.

Council Highlights

- Minutes were approved unanimously
- A motion was made to keep the coffee time but to use individual creamers, to keep social
 distance and to encourage those who are sick not to come. The motion passed unanimously.
- Council made a motion to divide 10% of Easter Offering (\$2,727.86) and send this to USC Lutheran Ministry, God's Helping Hands, and Epworth Children's Home (\$909.29 each). The motion passed unanimously.
- A motion was made to increase the hourly salary for George Crowe by \$1.00 per hour in October. The motion passed unanimously.
- A motion was made to send the Ministry Site Profile to Bishop Ginny Aebischer after council has read this and made any recommendations or changes. The motion passed unanimously.

Pastoral Ponderings

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD!" ~Psalm 122:1

I will never forget the gut-wrenching sound of the council's unified, but terrified, voice when they voted to stop in-person worship in March of 2020. So much unknown lay ahead of us, so much fear and anxiety surround that decision, and so much worry about the future of the Church was held in each person sitting around that table. And so, the Church went dark – literally. We cut off lights that wouldn't come back on for almost a year. We powered down HVAC units because no one was in this building to benefit from it, and the staff started working from home more than they were in the office. What was going to happen to THE Church, much less, Mt. Tabor.

But then, in July and August, we started entertaining the idea of coming back, and we saw a small flicker of a light off in the distance. We heard God's call to open the Church doors, and so in September, we welcomed small crowds back into the Sanctuary, and that light grew stronger. In December, our congregation sang together, and the praises of God echoed once more, from floor to rafter, and on Christmas Eve we saw people we haven't seen all year come through those doors. As the light of Christ grew even more, we saw the once small crowds get bigger, and week by week, a few more of God's people returned to Mt. Tabor. As the masks came off, we saw God's people's faces smiling with the brilliant light that we all have missed so much, and we went into summer hoping that our progress would not be short-lived.

Yet the COVID numbers went back up, and while some have made it back, many have not. As we enter into October of 2021, you need to hear this, WE MISS YOU! And we are ready for you to come home. You all have done a great job being the Church out in this dark world, but we are ready for you to return and to sit back in these pews together.

As this fall pushes onward, we are doing everything in our power to keep the people gathered in our Sanctuary safe. We will continue to offer three worship opportunities on Sunday (8:15, 9:35, & 11:00) to provide adequate space for people to distance themselves out. We are in compliance with the City of West Columbia's mask ordinance and inviting everyone to be masked while on campus. We are doing our best to contact-trace in the event there is an exposure, and we continue to update our COVID guidelines every two weeks.

I know many of you have become very comfortable worshiping in your PJ's on Sunday or even later in the week through our online services. And while that outlet will remain open for those that cannot be at Church, for those of you that can, it's time for you to come home. The people of God need to be together, and we are not whole until you come back.

It's time to come home! We miss you!


FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR

Organ

The organ has had some issues with intermittent dead notes since the time of my audition in January. The gentlemen that service the organ have worked with the keyboards several times and they seem to have failed partly due to age and also because the keyboards were kept from the previous organ so that the ivory keys would be retained. Ivory is no longer available/legal unless it is reused from an older keyboard. Randall Dyer (the organ builder) spent a day trying to assess the keyboards and regulate the keys and we still have some dead notes. He has recommended that we change the key contacts from a physical system to one that is optical. He has had several other older keyboards respond well to this system. We are waiting for the cost of the repair work to be submitted. Please note that the labor is extensive with this project and the organ would be down for at least one Sunday and possibly more. If we are able to repair the organ, the keyboards would be taken back to the workshop to be fitted with the new contact system.

Choir and Handbells

Singers and Ringers are encouraged to volunteer for the Adult Choir and Transfigure Ringers. The Adult Choir meets on Wednesdays at 6:30 and Transfigure Ringers meet on Mondays at 6 PM. 


This year we will focus our collecting efforts on baby items.






