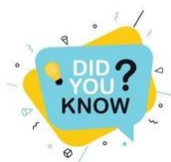

- Motion was made to approve \$1,100 purchase of admin computer and up to \$9,753.07 for new server. Motion was approved unanimously. We will get another estimate for Dell equipment for server.

PONDERINGS

~Pastor Wade -

"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability." Acts 2:1-4

This Memorial Day weekend, while many will be celebrating with BBQ and cookouts, taking time off work, and having fun out on the lake, we within the body of Christ not only remember the ultimate sacrifice that many have made for the sake of this country, but we remember day of Pentecost and the gift of the Holy Spirit coming to reside with us. This is the same Holy Spirit that called so many of our friends and family into the military, whom God used to protect us and our freedoms, and through the courage of that same Spirit, gave their lives in service to God and country. We give thanks for their sacrifice, and for the lives they now live in the presence of their Savior.

We also give thanks this weekend for the Holy Spirit's call to eight young adults going through confirmation, and the nudge of the Spirit in their lives as they assume and affirm their faith before the church. These eight young people have given serious thought and discernment to who God is and what God is up to in their lives, and they have each, in their own way, discovered God given gifts and talents to use for the kingdom of God. The same Spirit that hovered over the waters at creation and called forth life into the world, is the same Spirit that dwells deeply in each one of these confirmands, and with the same Spirit that calls them to change the world as we know it.

These eight young adults all sat confidently in front of Council this past Sunday and gave to them accounts of their confirmation experience and their personal faiths and testimonies to Jesus in their lives. I could not have been more proud of each one of them as they each spoke about the Spirit's involvement in their lives at church, school, and home. They articulated, not only what they learned, but how each of them have grown deeper in their faiths, and how prayer, worship, and Christian education have formed them for the promises that they will affirm on Pentecost.

The promises to live among God's faithful people, to come to the Word of God and participate in the Holy Supper, to proclaim the Good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth.

This is what they will promise, and it's what you promised, and will reaffirm on Pentecost as well. This is our mission and ministry at Mt Tabor, not only to carry these out on our own, but to help each other fulfill these promises in every life within the church. God has come through His Spirit to bless these lives of faith and meets each of us where we are; not to leave us there, but to change us, with these young adults, into the new creations in Christ that God longs for us to be.

For these new Confirmands, their families, and their faith, We can all say this day with confidence and hope, THANKS BE TO GOD!

Choir Trip to NYC has been postponed to 2025!

Mt. Tabor's Choir has been invited to participate in a concert at Carnegie Hall in 2025. It was originally scheduled for June of 2024. The specific dates haven't been announced. For your information, I am including the price list that was originally given to us for 2024. I suspect that there will be some increases for 2025. This will give you an idea of costs associated with the trip. All are invited as either a participant or a spectator. Extra rehearsals will be expected of all participants! The sample price for residency (2024) is as follows:

Quadruple occupancy (2 double bed/four people) is \$1,699 per person

Triple occupancy (2 bed/three people) is \$2,041 per person

Double occupancy (2 beds/two people or 1 bed/two people) is \$2,354 per person

Single occupancy is \$2,912 per person.

The above totals include:

four nights lodging at a four-star hotel in midtown

post-concert two-hour cruise with buffet dinner

8.5 X 11 print of the marquee poster (performers)

Complimentary ticket (value of \$125) for non-performers.

AIR TRAVEL to and from NYC is NOT included. We will have the option of using a travel agent (of our choosing which may be the agency suggested by MidArmerica Productions) as a group.

A screening is a tool that has been proven by research to help identify symptoms of a mental health disorder. MHA's screening tools provide an anonymous, free and private way to learn about your mental health and if you are showing warning signs of a mental illness.

Mental Health Screening Tools

A screening only takes a few minutes, and after you are finished you will be given information about the next steps you should take based on the results. A screening is not a diagnosis, but it can be a helpful tool for starting a conversation with your doctor or a loved one about your mental health.

Positivity Fit: Body, Mind and Soul June 2023

Positivity Fit meets Monday and Thursday in the Assembly Room at 5:30. All ability levels are welcome! Variations to exercises are offered!

Body: Feet and Ankles

Oh, my aching feet! A long day at work, walking for miles at the amusement park or just a busy day on your feet can cause your feet to ache and make you feel tired all over. So, can you do anything to strengthen your feet? You certainly can! The first thing is to make sure that you have well fitting shoes. You can have your feet measured for a proper length and width. Ladies, limit the time in high heels. A proper fit along with strengthening exercises will improve more than just your feet but your ankles and balance too!

Improving strength and flexibility of the foot can be accomplished through a few exercises that can be completed at home and many from the comfort of your easy chair. When you strengthen the muscles in your feet you keep your ankles more stable. Stability decreases the chance for falls and injury to the feet, ankles and lower legs. After strengthening, stretching is also important! Gentle stretching helps joint mobility and conditions the tendons and ligaments keep your feet moving.



Standing Stretch: Stand facing a wall, one leg forward and slightly bent, back leg is straight with heels flat on the floor.

Press hip forward toward the wall and hold for 30 seconds then relax for 30 seconds, repeat. Repeat with the opposite side.

Golf Ball Roll or Tennis Ball: Seated, both feet on the floor, roll a golf ball (tennis ball) under the arch of your foot. Repeat for the other foot.



Towel Tug: Seated on the floor or a chair, leg straight, loop a towel around the ball of the feet, hold both ends of the towel in your hands, with straight legs gently pull the towel toward your body. Hold for 30 seconds, repeat.

Calf Raises: Standing behind a chair, counter or wall, feet flat on floor, lift heels as high as you can then lower, repeat.

Ankle Motion: Seated, lift one or both feet off the floor, make small circles with your feet moving only at the ankle, repeat in the reverse direction. Then move feet side to side moving only from the ankle.

Ankle Pump: Seated, lift one or both feet off the floor, move only from the ankles, bring toes toward your leg as far as you can, hold for 10 seconds then press your foot out as straight as you can, hold 10 seconds, repeat. Complete exercise for both feet.

Toes Pick Ups: Seated, place small objects like marble on the floor, grab the objects with your toes and place them to the side, OR place a towel on the floor, grab the towel with your toes, relax and repeat.

Ankle Flex: Seated on the floor or chair, legs straight, use an elastic band around the ball of the foot, hold both ends of the elastic band, flex the foot forward then back, repeat. Complete the exercise on the other foot.

Single Leg Balance: Standing, keep knees straight, lift one foot off the floor, balance and hold for 30 seconds then relax, Repeat.


Complete on the other leg. ****Keep a chair or counter close by in case you need to hold on to gain balance**** To make this more challenging complete bare foot.

Mind:

In each foot your feet have over 7000 nerve endings in the soles, 26 bones. 30 joints and over 100 muscles, tendons and ligaments. Your feet send a lot of information to the brain! All the working parts must work together to ensure your ability to move and to help you stay stable. When your feet are strong and healthy you feel more confident that you will not fall or that your feet and legs will not become injured. Exercising your feet and ankles has a direct connection to the brain. Exercise increases blood flow which brings fresh oxygen and nutrients to the brain which is essential for cognition. These little exercises strengthen your feet, ankles and mind which can be completed while you watch TV. Include several of these exercises in your daily routines for good foot and brain health.

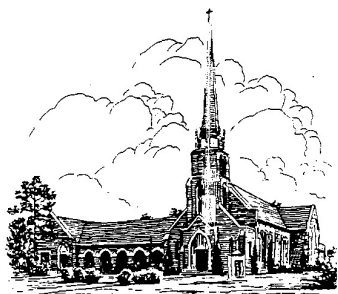
