Council Highlights - September 14th Meeting

Council Highlights:

- Minutes were approved.
- The Finance Committee proposed that Council choose either 50/50 or 30/70 Target Allocation ETF Portfolios to combine several bank accounts into one investment. Council voted unanimously to accept the 30/70 Target Allocation ETF Portfolio. Todd Sease and Travis Spainhour will be notified to proceed with this.
- A Congregational Meeting will be held November 16th to present the proposed 2026 Budget, ask questions and to accept nominees for Council. A second Congregational Meeting will be held November 30th to vote on 2026 the proposed budget and to elect 4 new Council members plus one Endowment Committee member.

Pastoral Ponderings

"And I tell you, you are (Mt Tabor Lutheran Church), and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it." Matt 16:18 (edited)

Mt Tabor, Happy Birthday! You're officially 139 years old. You look great for your age, and you should be proud of who you have grown into over the last century. You have weathered some intense storms, you have experienced growth physically and spiritually, and you have led the SC Synod in meaningful and faithful ways. Congratulations, to another fulfilling year of ministry in West Columbia.

In 1886, a group of faithful men and women from in a neighborhood called New Brookland (present day West Columbia) followed God's call to begin a new congregation. Led by their first pastor, the Reverend E.L. Lybrand, Mt. Tabor Lutheran Church was formed. For 139 years, many pastors later, God has not only remained faithful to us, but has used this congregation to be a beacon of light for our town.

Here are a few facts about the USA in 1886, the year that Mt Tabor began its ministry to West Columbia, South Carolina.

Grover Cleveland was President of the United States. He was married in the White House, and dedicated the Statue of Liberty (a gift from France) in the NY harbor.

The largest recorded earthquake (7.6) in the history of the Southeast happened in Charleston, SC killing 100 people. It was felt as far away as Boston and Chicago and cause damage to buildings as far away as Ohio and Alabama.

The Apache Chief, Geronimo, surrenders to US troops signaling the end of the "Indian Wars" in the Southwest.

The "Tuxedo" was invented. An English style of Black-tie dress for men and was introduced at Tuxedo Park in New York. Its why we call it a "Tux."

Coco-Cola was invented and first sold in Atlanta, GA at Jacobs' Pharmacy.

Among many notable people, baseball great Ty Cobb was born and Poet Emily Dickinson dies in 1886.

Carl Benz (of Mercedes Benz) patented the first gasoline-powered car.

The Haymarket Affair (along with nationwide protest) help establish the 8 hour workday.

MT TABOR LUTHERAN CHURCH was formed!

139 years later, we are still committed to the same faithful calling that God set us on all those years ago. It's the faithful proclamation of the Word of God, the faithful administration of the Sacraments, the faithful gathering of God's people for worship, and the faithful building of this community.

While many important and significant things were happening around the world, important and significant things were happening in the lives of everyday people in everyday West Columbia, and Mt Tabor was showed up for every bit of it. We continue that tradition today, as God's people continue to show up and gather in the historic Church on B Avenue; sharing our lives with each other and continuing to build up the kingdom of God in this community.

We are proud of our past, but we continue to look to the future with confidence and hope that God goes with us. Renewed daily in the waters of our baptism, we persist into an unknown future to endure the storms that will come. We will continue to shine the light of Christ in this community for years to come! For Mt Tabor, we say this day, Thanks be to God!



Positively Fit: Body, Mind and Soul

Body: Oblique Muscles

Oblique muscles are part of the body's torso. There are 2 sets consisting of external and internal muscles. These muscles are located on both sides of the body and connect the ribs to the pelvis. They literally are your side muscles. These muscles are responsible for bending and twisting the torso, aid with breathing and help stabilize the core muscles. Oblique muscles are important for overall body movements!

Many of the exercises for the core involve oblique muscles, however, there are exercises that target the obliques and can be performed from a chair! These exercises should be performed slowly!

Seated Russian Twist: Sit in a chair with feet flat on the floor. Clasp your hands straight in front of you, arm

comfortable (do not over twist) then slow rotate to the left. Return to the starting position. This counts as one. Do ten sets. **Cross Body Crunch:** Seated in a chair, place your hands on the shoulder of the

fully extended at shoulder level, twist to the right only to where you feel

same side. Touch the elbow down to the opposite knee, return to sitting, keeping your hands in place, then repeat on the opposite side. This is one set. Do ten sets.

Side Leans: Seated in a chair, arms straight up overhead fully extended and next to the head. Lean to one side keeping the arm on that side of the head next to the head while the other arm remains straight up overhead. You will feel the muscles work as you lift back to the starting position, then repeat on the opposite side. This is one set. Do ten sets.

Lean Backs: Seated in a chair, scoot out from the back of the chair. Cross your arms across your body making an X over your chest. Lean back diagonally to the side of the chair lightly touching the edge of the back of the chair, return to the starting position, then repeat on the opposite side of the chair. This is one set. Do ten sets.

Side Bends: Seated in a chair, place your hands on the shoulder of the same side. Lean to the side as if you are going to touch the elbow to the chair seat. Return to the starting position, then repeat on the opposite side. This is one set. Do ten sets.

These exercises will target your internal and external obliques. They can be included in your regular routine or complete them as a quick targeted workout. These exercises can be performed at work at your desk if you need a little stress relief as well. Remember, sit in a chair with a straight back and pushed back into the seat of the chair. Complete these exercises *slowly!*

Mind:

Strong oblique muscles help support the lungs. The lungs bring fresh air into the body, bringing fresh oxygen into the blood stream. The brain needs fresh oxygen and when you exercise this fresh oxygen can increase serotonin in the brain. Serotonin helps to regulate the mood, reducing anxiety and reduces stress. Include daily exposure to sunlight and find a better emotional balance and mental clarity.


