## **Pastoral Ponderings**

Can you imagine it? Could you imagine walking roughly 93 miles, pulling and fighting with a donkey, hanging out with a fiancé (that you barely knew), trusting them with your life, expecting your first born to arrive any minute, not knowing where you would stay, not knowing what you could eat, or how you might survive; but setting out, and going because the government said they needed you to be counted? Could you imagine trying to figure all this out while also holding onto the fact that God called you into this life without your permission, trusting you to bring about the salvation of the whole world?

On this road and on this journey is where we find Joseph and Mary ultimately arriving at what we have come to understand as an inn; yet there was no room for them, and so they take up residence in a local barn where animals are kept for the night. What we have come to think of as a hotel style place must have been full of people all waiting to register for the census. A group of strangers - not willing to see the plight of an unwed mother and her companion. Casting them aside with their only offer being a barn full animals, leading them to use a feeding trough as a bed for their newborn baby. Yet, while this makes for a wonderful back drop of many Christmas Children's plays, maybe we have missed what was really happening to this holy family.

For starters, this inn was not a hotel, motel, or Holiday Inn like we think it was. In reality, houses were usually three stories tall, housing the host family on the middle floor and reserving the upper room for guests of the family. The same word that is usually translated as "inn" in the Christmas story is the same word in Greek used to host Jesus and His disciples for the Last Supper before the crucifixion. Joseph and Jesus both ask to use the Upper Room for their stay, as God prepared the world for a miracle.

The families that owned the Upper Room would not have been innkeepers like we have come to understand them today. They would been family, relatives and friends, who open their door, not to strangers, but close kinship. However, in the Christmas story, family turned family and friends away. As harsh as that sounds to our ears, we know a world in disarray like that - it is the world we live in today. Family member against family member, friend against friend.

Yet, the bottom floor, the "stable", the place that the masters kept their beasts of burden and their workhorses warm throughout the night, housed their livelihoods. It was this place, this lower level that they made room for the Emmanuel to enter into the world. It was here in the places of rejection and division, the places of unclean animals, the places of the huddled masses trying to keep warm, and the places of the unwelcome that Jesus enters in. Among the unforgotten, misunderstood, and lowly Jesus makes His first home. It's in the same places in your life, where the little Lord Jesus still lies His head.

These uncomfortable, rejected, workhorse havened hearts that you and I carry every day is where Jesus feels the most at home, and where He happily resides with and in you and me. This is where the story starts, where love takes hold, and where Jesus prefers to be. And this "so called inn" of our broken rejected hearts is where the story continues to thrive. For to you and me a child is born, a savior given! And it's for you and me, that the Emmanuel, God with us, comes close to heal, to feed, and to love us forever.

Merry Christmas Mt. Tabor!

#### Positively Fit: Body, Mind and Soul

We meet on Monday and Thursday at 5:30 in room 121, walking at 4:30. All ability levels are welcome! Variations of exercises are offered! (Join our group. If you have questions, please ask Tammy O'Quinn, Brennen Hutto or Carol Busbee)

#### Body: Knees

We use our knees hundreds or even thousands of times every day! They move us up to stand, or down to sit, which are added to all the walking we do with household chores, shopping, getting in and out of the car, and climbing stairs to name just a few. If you are active, you probably bend your knees hundreds of times per day. Maybe you add in a work-out during day which can add up to that much more movement. Common mistakes can hurt or injure the knees, such as worn out or incorrect fitting footwear, improper sitting that puts force on the joint, high impact exercise, or simply ignoring a pain that could be in the hip or the knee. Sometimes the knees hurt or ache from "over-doing-it" or arthritis. However, there are exercises that you can do to support the knee.

The muscles in your legs and glutes need to be strong to protect your knees. These muscles need to be stretchy and flexible to allow your knees to fully move and to move correctly.



Seated hip stretch - sit in a chair like a kitchen chair, sit tall and scoot to the back of the chair. Place your right ankle on top of your left knee. Gently slide your chest forward until you feel a stretch in your right outer hip and glute. Hold for 10 -30 seconds. Repeat on the other side.



Seated Hamstring stretch - sit tall in a kitchen chair and scoot to the front edge of the chair. Keep the left knee bent and foot on the floor. Extend the right leg out straight with your heel on the floor while keeping the foot flexed. Gently slide your chest forward until you feel a stretch in the back of your thigh. Hold for 10-30 seconds. Repeat on the other leg.



Seated leg extensions - sit tall in a kitchen chair with both feet on the floor. Slowly straighten one knee until it is level with you hip or completely straight. Hold for a few seconds then lower. Do 10-20 reps on one leg then repeat on the other leg.

You can do stretches daily but remember not to force a stretch further than what is comfortable.

Other exercises that you already do help the knees too. Exercises like squats and lunges that strengthen the quads which support the knees. Calf raises and step ups along with hamstring curls strengthen the muscles in the calf's, quads and glutes. Low impacts sports like swimming and cycling add benefit to knee strength. Stretches and strength training are important for the knees and to be able to support movement, help our balance and stability which protects the knees from pain and injury.

#### Mind:

Being mobile is important for general wellbeing. When you can get around and do the things you like to do, you are happier and healthier. Walking is good for the body but can help the mind too. Engaging in activities like walking releases endorphins which naturally increase mood and reduce stress. Strong knees make it easier to engage in regular exercise which combats anxiety and promotes a positive state of mind. Strong knees give us physical freedom to move around fully and do the things that make us happy!




