"Take A Giant Leap"

I was going on ten years old in July 1969 when the first men stepped on the moon. We gathered around televisions in silence, leaning forward, awed at every second of a new age, and wondering how they could get down a ladder and leap in those big baggy boots.

I knew it was a good thing, but I couldn't explain why. "Just because we can" was not good enough for me. Now I know that someday the sun will burn out and we will need a new home. The moon is our first step in developing an escape plan. There were also things found on the moon that we can use. A rock was even discovered on the moon we didn't know we had on earth until we found it on the moon. "Armalcolite" was named for the Apollo 11 astronauts Armstrong, Aldrin, and Collins and has since been found in several places including Spain, Ukraine, Greenland, South Africa and Montana.

It was important that the first Apollo astronauts were test pilots. Knowing how to fly and jump were much more important than knowing where to find rocks. The first real geologist in space, Harrison "Jack" Schmidt didn't arrive on the moon until the final Apollo mission (Apollo 17) in 1972. 





Show and Tell of some very interesting specimens including a termite enclosed in amber, fossilized dinosaur dung and fluorescent minerals.

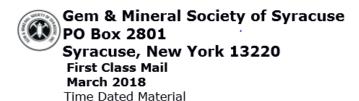
