"Days of Future Fossils"

Every once in a while, I find a website I get really excited about. The one I am about to tell you about is now several years old. I am accustomed to hearing "Where have YOU been?" so I will hold no grudge against anyone who thinks I am behind the times. (I already know!)

In case you missed it, there is a website called: "Ancient Earth Globe" and here is the link: <u>https://dinosaurpictures.org/ancient-earth#0</u>.

The site was created by Ian Webster in collaboration with some paleogeographic maps done by Christopher Scotese.

On the site you will find a turning globe. You can type in your city and find what the earth looked like millions of years ago. I typed in my hometown of Seneca Falls, NY, chose 400 million years ago and found, as predicted, the town was all under water. It's drier now, and the falls are gone, but growing up I found the fossils of plants and animals that were living and under those waters 400 million years ago. With a click of an arrow, you can go back millions of years. You can also see when the first dinosaurs, flowers, or insects appeared.

Next time you see a fish or plant in a river or sea, click an arrow in time in your mind. Try to visualize what that fish or plant may look like as a fossil of the future. (Do not try this with your relatives.)
