SECTION VIII * MODIFIED (MS/JHS) RULES

- NFHS Rules * Unless otherwise specified
- Roster Provided for each team, with (Head) Coach(es) listed as well
- Playing Time
 - Two 35 Minute HALVES
 - NO PERIODS
 - NO Over Time (OT)
 - Coaches can agree to less time (halves, i.e. 2 x 30 minutes)
 - Each team may have 1 timeout per half
 - During their possession or on any dead ball
 - If during live play, restart is drop ball to the team that called the time out
 - 2 minutes in length

Uniforms

- Schools should communicate with opponents about uniforms, if they do not have white uniforms for away games. Home uniforms should have colors
- The NFHS regulations that the boys' and girls' soccer goalie uniform jerseys be numbered and all white home uniforms shall be waived at the modified level
- If conflict, Use common sense (Rule 18), USE PINNIES * PLAY MATCH

Equipment

- Only sneakers or shoes with molded soles and molded cleats are permitted in the modified program. Shoes with metal posts or spikes are not permitted in any modified sport
- Shin guards worn at all times under their socks, Players cannot play without shin guards
- No MICRO SHIN GUARDS
- A mouthpiece May be worn by the soccer goalie for protective purposes (NOT Required)
- Goalie helmets are not necessary but allowed if an athlete would like to wear it

Playing Rules

- BOTH Teams must have 11 players on the field to start the game.
- Games cannot start without less than 11 players
- Free substitution (Either Team) is permitted when the ball goes over the sideline or end line
- If a player is injured, and cannot return, and there are no substitutes available for that team, that team can play shorthanded
- The slide tackle is permitted
- The overhead scissors kick is permitted
- The flip throw-in shall be permitted
- In the event of the disqualification of a player, a substitution must be made for that disqualified player. If a team has no eligible substitute, the team may continue to play shorthanded.
- Minimum Number of Players (once game starts) is 7
- Corner flag posts must be flexible in nature (wood, plastic, or plastic foam) and conform to the NFHS
 rule standard of not being less than 5 feet high. Plastic traffic cones may be substituted in place of
 corner flags
