Re: Civil Rights Complaint against New Jersey Transit Operations and Police Powers Good day -

The New Jersey Transit (NJT) agency has engaged in a pattern of discriminatory and retaliatory actions against me from my arrival in the northern New Jersey area in August 2007. These activities were halted for a time earlier in 2022. These issues began reoccurring in NJT Route 158 bus operations/police powers activities and on the NJT mobile app recently. They include, for example, buses departing at the moment I arrive at the Port Authority Bus Terminal (PABT) gate in New York City (PABT gate 202 or 301) and/or significantly before the listed scheduled time in the NJT mobile app at the stop 352 feet south of Thompson Lane.

Prior to the reoccurrence of these activities, I sent an Evidence Preservation Letter to NJT and its police powers unit on April 15, 2022. The Evidence Preservation Letter addressed to New Jersey Transit on April 15, 202, an extension on June 19, 2022, and an incident report describing the specific actions undertaken by New Jersey Transit on June 19, 2022, are attached.

A similar set of problems has occurred with various other police powers operations since my arrival in August 2007 in the NYC/NJ area. While the current prejudicial and retaliatory conduct has occurred primarily on this NJT 158 bus run, similar problems were encountered at times during my NJT rail trips between Ramsey, NJ and Penn Station, NYC between April 2011 and October 2018. I relocated from Ramsey to Edgewater, NJ in November 2018. I have also experienced various female undercover officer "honey traps" on Route 158 bus runs from 2018 into early 2022 when those ceased, though NYPD continues them in NYC.

NJT police powers activities may pre-date August 2007 as it may have been a party to prior trafficking activities involving my movements from Washington state to Boston, Massachusetts, thence to northern New Jersey between 2002 and 2007, which trafficking activities appear to have been a coordinated effort integrating FBI and various other police powers and intelligence operations in Massachusetts, New Jersey, and New York.

While not directly relevant to any future inquiry by your office, police powers agencies are also currently continuing their civil rights violations on various online dating sites (including Hinge, Match, and Tinder) as they have from 2004 into the present in both Washington/Oregon

where I lived until December 2005 and New Jersey/New York since August 2007. State and local police powers agencies as well as FBI and other federal agencies have also contributed to these and other civil rights violations over many years. A civil lawsuit is pending appeal in DC US Circuit Court at this time. Reference US DC District Court case 22-cv-996 and Appellate Court 22-5158 for further information if desired.

Re: NOTICE OF DUTY TO PRESERVE EVIDENCE

Good day:

Dennis Sheldon Brewer has filed a lawsuit against the Federal Bureau of Investigation and various federal, state, and local law enforcement and intelligence agencies. This letter amends that letter dated April 15, 2022 to extend the period during which evidence must be preserved to include all New Jersey Transit operations and police powers involvement in any activity related to the Plaintiff and Complainant Dennis Sheldon Brewer during the period from August 2007 to present operations through the date of this letter and to any and all future activities undertaken by New Jersey Transit and its police powers operations for use in my civil lawsuit and in any future civil rights investigation of the agency by the Federal Transit Administration Office of Civil Rights.

While your Agency is not yet formally named in the lawsuit, it will be upon the next amendment of named Defendants. The preservation of all documents for the duration of the litigation or until you are notified in writing you are not subject to this litigation is required under federal law and the Rules of Civil Procedure of the US District Court. This requirement extends to your agency's contacts with and targeting of the Plaintiff from Plaintiff's arrival in the State of New Jersey in August 2007 into the present and includes, without limitation, all honey trap operations, other interferences with civil rights, and purposeful service and scheduling manipulations contacts in violation of federal civil rights law and U.S. Department of Transportation regulations during use and attempted use by Plaintiff of NJ Transit facilities, trains, and buses.

Pursuant to the federal Rules of Civil Procedure, every party to a lawsuit has a duty to preserve all evidence which could be relevant to the suit. This includes the duty to preserve all electronic and paper-based evidence, such as notes, emails, communication logs, recordings, plans, analyses, and other relevant materials discussing the incidents or related to matters at issue in the suit. The suit contemplates a broad and durable set of civil rights violations, constitutional rights violations, wrongful process, conduct not permitted under Article I Section 8 of the Constitution, and eminent domain violations. Statutes cited or to be cited in conjunction with the contemplated federal Complaint include the Klu Klux Klan Act, civil RICO, and FTCA.

This duty to preserve evidence is broad and extends to all documents, regardless of whether the document is stored electronically (such as email) or in hard-copy and regardless of the type of document. For example, reports, spreadsheets, photographs, and videotapes are all considered documents that must be preserved. Furthermore, the duty to preserve this documentary evidence extends to all documents in existence as of the time you reasonably anticipated this litigation. This Notice covers information retained on all computers, servers, server back-up systems, CDs, tapes, PDAs, cell phones, and any other device on which information may be stored electronically.

To avoid civil or criminal sanctions by the Court, ensure that all relevant documents are preserved, and no alterations are allowed. Communicate directly with all employees who have possession or control of potentially relevant evidence, including but not limited to personnel who deal with email retention, deletion, and archiving. Advise each of these employees to preserve any relevant documents in their custody. Furthermore, advise all such persons that any regularly scheduled and/or automatic deletion of email or other electronic documents must be discontinued with respect to any relevant data. In addition, any document destruction (such as shredding of documents) must cease with respect to any relevant documents. All relevant documents, both electronic and paper, must be preserved for the duration of this litigation.

## NJT Bus Operations Incident Report, June 19, 2022:

Discriminatory and/or retaliatory New Jersey Transit Operations/Police Power Activities on Route 158 to Port Authority Bus Terminal in New York City:

Occurrences below are documented for the date June 19, 2022, only, though they have occurred routinely up to this date.

Stop: 352 feet south of Thompson Lane on Route 158 southbound to NYC/PABT.

Runs scheduled at this stop for 2:39pm and 3:13pm on June 19, 2022. 3:13pm scheduled time appeared on Google Maps, was not shown on NJT mobile app. (Schedule information for this route is typically not available on my NJT mobile app and/or is frequently disappeared on NJT mobile app.)

2:39pm run does not show up at stop at all. 3:13pm run does not show up at stop near the real time updated scheduled time shown on the mobile app, then disappears from mobile app thereafter.

I return home to City Place (about 500 feet away from stop) at 3:20pm, leave home to return to stop at about 3:26pm. Route 158 bus leaves stop at 3:28pm as I am able to see it cross the Penny Lane line of sight (which is about 150 south of the stop) as it travels south on River Road while walking in Penny Lane on my return to the stop.

I return to stop at 3:29pm

3:43pm advised as next stop time on NJT mobile app. At 3:43pm a 158 run crosses my view headed north toward Fort Lee from NYC. (This sort of schedule flipping occurred nearly every time I attempted to travel to NYC on Route 158 between September 2007 and October 2010.) I recheck NJT mobile app for 158 to NYC/PABT shortly thereafter and note that Route 158 has again completely disappeared from NJT mobile app.

When checked again, next revised time of next bus is 4:13pm, then it changes to 4:21pm when checked again at 4:07pm.

4:21 pm is changed to 4:33pm on next check at 4:21pm. Bus arrives at stop at 4:33pm and trip to PABT/NYC operates normally.
