
AN IMPORTANT PART OF OUR WORSHIP IS THIS SHARED MEAL





Announcements

This year marks 100 years since the establishment of Christ the King Sunday, first proclaimed in 1925 through the encyclical Quas Primas. Written in a time of growing unrest, it reminded the Church that our true hope and allegiance rest in the reign of Jesus Christ. The encyclical described His kingdom as one of truth, holiness, justice, love, and peace, calling believers to lift high Christ's sovereign rule above every earthly power. On this centennial, we join Christians around the world in declaring: Christ is King—now and forever.

Excerpt from Quas Primas (1925) Establishing the Feast of Christ the King

"Christ must reign in our minds,
which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief
to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ.
"He must reign in our wills,
which should obey the laws and precepts of God.

"He must reign in our hearts, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things, and cleave to him alone.

"He must reign in our bodies and in our members, which should serve as instruments for the interior sanctification of our souls....

"It is Our fervent desire, Venerable Brethren, that those who are without the fold may seek after and accept the sweet yoke of Christ, and that we, who by the mercy of God are of the household of the faith, may bear that yoke, not as a burden but with joy, with love, with devotion."
