

Clothed and in Our Right Mind

Summary

This sermon explores the transformative power of Jesus through the biblical story of the demon-possessed man living among the tombs. The pastor draws parallels between the man's situation and modern-day struggles of marginalized communities, emphasizing how Jesus meets people in their darkest places and restores them. The message highlights the difference between restrictive religion and liberating faith, while emphasizing that when people are 'clothed and in their right mind' through Christ, they become powerful agents of change.

Intro Prayer

Questions
