Known and Loved

Devotional

Have you ever had someone who knows you so well they can tell what you're thinking just by looking at you? That deep level of understanding brings comfort and security. Now imagine someone who knows you even more intimately - your Creator. God's knowledge of us goes beyond surface-level facts; He understands our deepest fears, greatest joys, and innermost thoughts. Bible Verse

'The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want.' - Psalm 23:1

Reflection Question

How does knowing that God understands you completely - including your fears and anxieties - change the way you approach your relationship with Him?

Quote

Day 2:

Finding True Security

Devotional

Bible Verse
