Day 1: The Supreme Worth of Christ

Devotional

Have you ever collected something valuable? Maybe stamps, coins, or baseball cards? We often assign great worth to material possessions, achievements, or status. Reflection Question

Day 2: Tears in the Wilderness

Devotional

Life's wilderness seasons can feel endless and purposeless. Like walking through a desert, our tears might seem to disappear into parched ground without effect. Yet God's economy wastes nothing - not even our tears. Each drop carries purpose, each moment of suffering holds meaning. Bible Verse

Reflection Question

Day 3: Hidden Springs

Devotional

Bible Verse

"See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." - Isaiah 43:19

Reflection Question

Where in your life do you need God to bring refreshment right where you are?

Quote God does not always have to bring you to the water. God can bring the water to you right where you are.

Prayer

Lord, open my eyes to see the springs You're creating in my current circumstances. Help me trust Your provision even before I see it. Amen.

Day 4: Never Forsaken

Devotional

When circumstances overwhelm us, it's easy to feel forgotten by God. The silence can be deafening, and His absence can feel very real. Yet even in these moments, God remains closer than we realize. God sees every detail of our struggle, knows every thought in our mind, and holds every tear we cry. Bible Verse

Reflection Question

Prayer

Faithful God, thank You for Your constant presence. Help me trust You're working even when I can't see it. Strengthen my faith in Your unfailing love. Amen.

Day 5: From Tears to Triumph

Devotional

Every tear we shed tells a story - of loss, pain, disappointment, or heartache. Yet in God's kingdom, tears aren't just expressions of sorrow; they're seeds of future joy. Like a farmer who plants in hope of harvest, our seasons of weeping will give way to seasons of rejoicing. This isn't mere positive thinking; it's a divine promise.
