A RESOLUTION

To preserve Greenspace in the Town of Sheldon

The Town of Sheldon has a long proud history in the Agricultural Industry. This industry has supplied economic security to its residents for the Two Hundred (200) years of its history.

The town is located in the County of Wyoming, State of New York. In 2007 Wyoming County was ranked first in the state and twentieth in the nation in the production of dairy.

The Agriculture Industry, in all its various aspects, requires large tracts of land, Partnered with the Right to Farm Law and the Wyoming County Comprehensive Plan of 2001 (Target Tomorrow), in an effort to promote and secure the Agricultural Industry in the Town of Sheldon, we the Town Board of Sheldon, set forth a resolution limiting the amount of new residential house permits to a maximum of Ten (10) per year.

As seen in the chart below, limiting new house permits to a maximum of ten (10) per year, is not impeding the growth of the town, but will insure it remains at the constant rate of growth it has seen over the last Thirty-Three (33) years.

Building permits issued due to the loss of a residence from fire, flood or other disaster are <u>not</u> to be included in the calculation of, maximum of new housing permits of Ten (10) per year.

Calendar year for this local law is from January 1 to December 31.

Variances to this local law may be issued on a case-by-case discretion of the Zoning Board of Appeals.
