The Town Clerk, Carol Zittel, reported on the following:

NYS Department of Taxation – 2019 Full Aid Certification

The Town received a congratulations letter from the NYS Dept. of Taxation & Finance commending the Town Assessor for "maintaining a system of real property tax administration that meets the highest standards set by the State." The Town will receive a voucher in the amount of \$4,458.25 from the Office of the State Comptroller.

Delaware River Solar

A letter was received from Delaware River Solar regarding a possible solar farm in Sheldon.

Reports

The Town Supervisor financial reports, cash flow reports, Town Clerk August report and Town Justice August reports were distributed.

Highway Superintendent Report

Highway Superintendent David Ricketson reported on the following:

Patching & Shimming

The Department has been busy patching and shimming Town roads.

New 10-Wheeler Truck

The new truck was slated to arrive yesterday but no notification has been received yet. Once it arrives it has to go to Marquart to get equipped. The Superintendent expects one to two months before the Department has possession of the truck.

Sand – Gernatt

The Department will be purchasing sand from Gernatt this year.

CHIPS Funding

Supt. Ricketson reported that CHIP funding may be cut by 20% this year.

Purchase of New Pickup Truck

There was a short discussion on whether the Town should purchase a new pickup truck for the Highway Superintendent this year. The Board tabled discussion until the next board meeting.

Advertising Old Plow for Sale

The Board had a short discussion on whether the old snow plow should be listed for sale before the new truck arrives. The Board tabled the issue until October. The Board would like to open bids on the sale of the old plow at the November meeting.

Senator Gallivan Meeting

Senator Gallivan met Supervisor Becker at the Town Hall this month. Supervisor Becker thanked him for his assistance in obtaining funding for the salt building (\$75,000) and for aiding the Town in addressing the Route 98 road erosion.

Wyoming County Board of Supervisors - Change in Chairperson

<u>Common Energy – Electric Supplier</u>

Mary McNall was present at tonight's meeting representing the company Common Energy. Ms. McNall informed the Board that she expects the Town to save approximately \$428 year if they make the switch to Common Energy as electric supplier. Supervisor Becker stated that he needs to first speak with Town Bookkeeper Katie Chmura and will have Attorney David DiMatteo draw up paperwork if the Board decides to proceed with this program.

North Java Fire District Expansion

The Board met at the North Java fire hall on September 15, 2020 and voted to approve the dissolution of the North Java Fire Protection District and the extension of North Java Fire District. A set of minutes for that meeting will be prepared.

Tax Override Law

The Town Board received a copy of the proposed Local Law to Override the Tax Cap. At the October meeting they will schedule a public hearing for the proposed law.

New Business:

Snow & Ice Contract – Wyoming County Highway

Review of Battery Energy Storage Law

The battery storage law as prepared by the Town Attorney had given permit approval authority to the Town Planning Board. The Town Board requested that the law be amended to state that the Town Board would have the authority to approve permits. There were several times in the law that the planning board was referenced – all references will be changed to the Town Board.

The Town Board also amended another section of the law so that it now requires that notices be sent via registered mail to neighboring property owners at the applicant's expense. Below is the amended section:

Subject to a public hearing to hear all comments for and against the application. The Town Board of the Town of Sheldon shall have a notice printed in a newspaper of general circulation in the Town at least five (5) days in advance of such hearing. The notice shall be mailed by the Town Zoning Officer via registered mail to adjoining landowners or landowners within two hundred (200) feet of the property at least ten (10) days prior to such a hearing. The Applicant shall be responsible for mailing fees of all notices. Proof of mailing shall be provided to the Town Board at the public hearing.

The Town Clerk will request that the Attorney's office make these changes.

Review of Solar Energy Systems Law

The Town Board reviewed the solar energy systems law as presented and requested that following changes be made to the setbacks:

 - ii. The setback from the nearest road for all solar collectors constructed as part of a large-scale ground-mounted solar energy system to the first solar panel shall be 300 150 feet.
 - iii. The setback from any structure on an adjourning lot for all solar collectors constructed as large-scale ground-mounted solar energy system to the first solar panel shall be 500 feet.
 - iviii. The setback from any cemetery for all solar collectors constructed as part of a large-scale ground-mounted solar energy system to the first solar panel shall be $\frac{300}{150}$ feet from the closest grave site, or proposed grave site.
 - viv. The setback from any park for all solar collectors constructed as part of a large-scale ground-mounted solar energy system to the first solar panel shall be $\frac{300}{150}$ feet to the boundary of the park.
- b. All other setbacks for all solar energy system equipment and components/structures developed as part of a large-scale rooftop-mounted, building-mounted and/or ground-mounted solar energy system not identified above shall be 200 100 feet.

11. Setbacks.

- a. Utility-scale ground-mounted solar energy systems.
 - i. The setback from the property line for all solar collectors constructed as part of a utility-scale ground-mounted solar energy system shall be 300 feet 150 feet to the first solar panel.

- ii. The setback from the nearest road center for all solar collectors constructed as part of a utility-scale ground-mounted solar energy system to the first solar panel shall be 300 feet 150 feet.
- iii. The setback from any structure on an adjourning lot for all solar collectors constructed as utility scale ground mounted solar energy system to the first solar panel shall be 500 feet.
- iii. The setback from any cemetery for all solar collectors constructed as part of a utility-scale ground-mounted solar energy system to the first solar panel shall be 300 feet 150 feet from the closest grave site, or proposed grave site.
- iv. The setback from any park for all solar collectors constructed as part of a utility-scale ground-mounted solar energy system to the first solar panel shall be 300 feet 150 feet to the boundary of the park.
