

**CITY OF SEDAN
MINUTES OF JUNE 23, 2026**

The Sedan City Council met for a special meeting on June 23rd, 2026, beginning at 12:00 PM, to discuss public works street sweeper, road grader, and pool chemicals. The meeting was called to order by the Mayor Kathy Miller.

Roll Call: present: Adam Clark, Crystal Wade and Wellington Butler. Absent: Angela Evans and Nathan Blankinship.

Employees present: City Clerk Lana Smith, Public Works Superintendent Caleb Ironsyde, and Chief of Police William Tunstall.

Attendees recited the pledge of allegiance and council member Wellington Butler said a prayer.

Crystal Wade made a motion to approve the agenda for the special meeting. Wellington Butler seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Public Works Street Sweeper-

Public Works Superintendent Caleb Ironsyde presented the council with two bids for rear tires for the street sweeper. C & L Tire gave a bid of \$747.96 and Main Street Auto gave a bid of \$ 624.42.

Adam Clark made a motion to approve the bid from Main Street Auto of \$624.42. Wellington Butler seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Public Works Road Grader-

Public Works Superintendent Caleb Ironsyde met with Chautauqua County's Road and Bridge supervisor and heavy equipment operator to discuss the issues with the road grader. They all agreed it is the starter and solenoid attached to the starter.

Got a bid from John Deere in Independence for a starter for the road grader priced at \$668.81 and if it does not come with a solenoid, it will be an additional \$45.32.

Crystal Wade made a motion to purchase the starter from John Deere not to exceed \$750.00. Adam Clark seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Pool Chemicals-

The pool is going through a lot of chemicals this year due to the rain. The pool will need seven more buckets of chemicals for this year. Each bucket is \$263.00 not including shipping.

Crystal Wade made a motion to approve the purchase of seven buckets of chemicals at \$263.00 plus shipping. Adam Clark seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Public Works Superintendent Caleb Ironsyde mentioned to the council that there is a need to replace the pool vacuum. The council requested this be on July 7th, 2026, agenda.

At 12:22 PM Crystal Wade made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Wellington Butler seconded the motion. Motion carried and meeting adjourned.
