Superintendent Update - Dr. Charleston

- Bandwith survey: 260 teachers and admins took a survey; results were overall positive
 - Concerns included being having to respond to school concerns after school hours, needing quiet spaces to work, and needing more time to complete tasks
 - Bandwith Committee met, staff was reassured they don't have to respond after school hours (contractually as well); the admin is looking for quiet spaces for staff to work; the burden of submitting detailed lesson plans was removed
- Climate survey to be released on 10/10 have until 10/21 to complete teachers and staff, partnered with Rutgers and DOE
 - All parents/students grades 3-8, can opt out, will take 15-20 mins
 - Totally anonymous, just aggregate data released to admin
- · Climate and Culture Committee meeting activity based ideas to come
 - Raffles, HSA door prizes; step competitions; first activity is staff social 10/19 and other steps to be determined after results of climate survey
- Time Use time wisely and efficiently. Emails should be addressed during school hours.
- Dr. Charleston has visited all the schools; happy, related environment, particularly among the MS/HS
- Enrollment update: smallest class is 160 seniors, 172 kindergarten; all others around 200 biggest classes are 26 kids
- District is fully staffed; BOE approved qualified math teacher replacement dual certified in math and special ed
 - TA deficit in Coleman but working on being addressed by ESS
 - Each school as 2 permanent subs and can move to other buildings as needed

- Hamilton extension on schedule for completion
- Budget continues to be on track. Planned an increase in both Healthcare and Malware Insurance. As well as 4 teachers at Hamilton School.
- The BOE meetings follow the state guidelines.
- Health Curriculum concerns direct to building principals.
- Office Hours will continue
- Candidate night 10/18.
