Update – Lake Erosion

The board is happy to share that after careful review and community feedback that we have started the installation of ShoreSOX in highly impacted areas in Lake 4 and 5. Quick reminder that ShoreSOX is a modular open containment system. It is then filled with a locally sourced organic media, such as topsoil or blow-in mulch that ultimately will be graded before the top portion of the mesh is wrapped.

Upon installation, the system halts soil erosion and re-stabilizes shorelines and hillsides. The short-term and long-term impacts include an immediately stable shoreline, which adds aesthetic value to all properties, an improved and enhanced ecosystem, and mitigated safety risks for residents, workers, and staff. great American roadside attractions as well as restaurants and other services that are close. And GasBuddy compares gas prices of all the nearest stations.



Remember To Dial 8-1-1

Building a deck? Planting a tree? 811 is the number you should call before you begin any digging project. A federally-mandated national "Call Before You Dig" number, 811 was created to help protect you from unintentionally hitting underground utility lines while working on digging projects.

Make a call for every digging job – even small projects like planting trees or shrubs. If you hit an underground utility line while digging, you can harm yourself or those around you, disrupt service to an entire neighborhood and potentially be responsible for fines and repair costs. According to data collected by CGA, when an individual makes a call to 811 before digging, damage occurs less than 1 percent of the time.
