#### **How To Report a Street Light Outage**

CenterPoint Energy maintains street lights throughout our electric service area in and around Houston. Please use the form on Centerpoint's website to report a street light outage at: www.centerpointenergy.com. When reporting, you will be asked to provide:

- A pole number for the non-functioning lights you want to report. If you already know the street light number, complete the form on the website or you can report a street light outage by using Centerpoint's online map to select the streetlight
- Contact information (in case more information is needed to locate a street light)
- An e-mail address (if you want feedback regarding your repair request)
- The number of street lights you would like to report

#### Call Before You Dig

Building a deck? Planting a tree? 811 is the new number you should call before you begin any digging project. A federally-mandated national "Call Before You Dig" number, 811 was created to help protect you from unintentionally hitting underground utility lines while working on digging projects. People digging often make risky assumptions about whether or not they should get their utility lines marked due to concerns about project delays, costs and previous calls about other projects. ### Lawn & Garden To Do List For August



Keep an eye on lawns to spot problems early and treat accordingly. Insects such as chinch bugs and fungi such as grey leaf spot are two things to watch out for.

Hummingbirds will be here!! Migrating hummingbirds can be found at your feeders and natural nectar sources. Keeping feeders clean, filled and in a shady area will encourage visitors. Natural nectar sources for hummingbirds include Turk's cap, Hamelia, shrimp plant, Firespike, Salvia, Lobelia (cardinal flower), Pride of Barbados, Anisacanthus, and cigar plants. These are all hummer magnets.

Use seaweed spray such as Microlife Seaweed to boost the immune system of plants. A healthy plant is more resistant to insect infestations and fungal problems. A spray-down every two weeks that covers the entire surface of all leaves will do the job. Continue slow, deep watering to encourage proper root growth and prevent runoff.

### **Watch For School Buses!**



School will soon be in session again. Did you know that passing a school bus that is loading or unloading children is illegal? The law states that even if you are on the opposite side of the road, driving in the opposite direction, you may not pass the bus unless the road is divided by a median, the bus has begun moving again, they have removed their Stop Sign or turned off their flashing red lights, or unless the driver has waived you on. Hefty fines of up to \$1,000 for violators! When driving in school zones, be alert and watch out for children. Look for children who might dart into the street without looking for traffic. Know and obey the laws concerning school zones and buses.
