A Year in Review

The Becker Family Foundation was founded in 2018 to expand awareness of and appreciation for stringed instruments. The BF Foundation allows young artists to benefit from the use of high-quality instruments that otherwise would not be available to them. The goal of this program is to unite talented students and young professional artists with instruments and instructors of a quality that encourages their growth as musicians and enables them to communicate more effectively through their music.



Since the beginning of 2019, something extraordinary has been happening in the Midlands. Created by the Becker family, The Becker Family Foundation and Play it Forward have been providing talented children of all backgrounds with the opportunity to learn and experience playing on fine string instruments. As a non-profit organization, The Becker Foundation provides string lessons and access to exceptional instruments to local children free of charge, giving them a chance to excel in an art form that, for many families, would be otherwise out of their reach. Classes began in February, where once a week students are given high level lessons in playing fine string instruments.


February also saw a trip to Bob Jones University, where student Katie Johnson was given use of a Paul Becker violin for a year and a half. "It's so important that these students have access to fine instruments for competition. A high performance instrument like those created by Paul Becker just allows for greater expression. With these instruments, students like Katie have the ability to compete on a larger scale and pursue her goal of joining a music conservatory," says Marilyn Becker, founding member of the Becker Family Foundation. About her instrument, Katie says "This violin feels like a friend and speaks to me. The message I am hearing is that together, we will learn to make wonderful music".

On June 6th, the group performed its first ever concert at St. Francis Episcopalian Church in Chapin, SC, treating the community and allowing the students to show off their newly acquired skills.

On December 7th, a quartette of players from the program performed Vivaldi for the Chapin Women's club event. The event was a success and gave the quartet invaluable experience playing Becker instruments for a hired event.

Next year will bring even more opportunities for learning, performance, and more. The Becker Family Foundation looks forward with passion to the opportunities they will continue to provide for aspiring musicians in the area.


Stringing & Singing with Sonia Lee & Friends Newberry Opera House

> Becker Family Spotlight Carl G. Becker

Carl G. Becker (1887 – 1975), whose active career spanned 73 years and encompassed every



facet of the luthier's art. After graduating grammar school at age 13, he apprenticed under a music store owner, William T. Lane, and made his first violin at 14 years old. Soon after, he began to work with Lyon and Healy, under the direction of John Hornsteiner. Once Hornsteiner opened his own violin shop in 1908, Carl G. joined him.

In 1924 he accepted an invitation from William Lewis & Son, a leading Chicago violin dealer, to become master luthier and instrument appraiser, with the understanding that

they would allow him to spend summers up in Northern Wisconsin to make instruments.
