PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

to the Honorable the Circuit Court of Barron County, WISCONSIN,
 The petition of Leopold Leisz hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:
 First. My place of residence is Fourth Lake, Barron County, WISCONSIN.
 Second. My occupation is Farmer.
 Third. I was born on the 15 day of August, anno Domini 1863, at Kennethsburg, Hungary.
 Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Bremen, Germany, on or about the 10 day of June,
 anno Domini 1902 and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York, N.Y., on the 10 day of June,
 anno Domini 1902 on the vessel Strom King Wilhelm.
 Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 30 day of June, anno Domini 1902,
 at Barron, Wis., in the Circuit Court of Barron County.
 Sixth. I am now married. My wife's name is Anna. She was born
Hungary, and now resides at Fourth Lake, Barron County, Wis.
 I have 8 children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows: Leo born May 8-1897 in
Hungary, Andrew born Sept 15-1898 in Hungary, Louis born April 11-1900
in Hungary, Anna born Mar 22-1902 in Hungary, Anton born Feb
14-1904 in Wis, Louis born July 15-1905 in Wis, Mary born Mar 1-1907
in Wis, Karl born Nov 24-1908 in Wis.
 all now reside at Fourth Lake, Barron Co, Wis.
 Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed
 to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my
 intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and
 particularly to Emperor of Austria and Francis Joseph, Apostolic King of Hungary of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention
 to reside permanently in the United States.
 Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.
 Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least, immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the
15 day of June, anno Domini 1902, and in the State of WISCONSIN, continuously next preceding the date of this
 petition, since the 20 day of June, anno Domini 1902, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this
 petition.
 Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the _____ Court of _____
 at _____, on the _____ day of _____, anno Domini 1_____, and the
 said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit, _____, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)
 Attached hereto and made a part of this petition is my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Commerce
 and Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of
 the United States of America.
