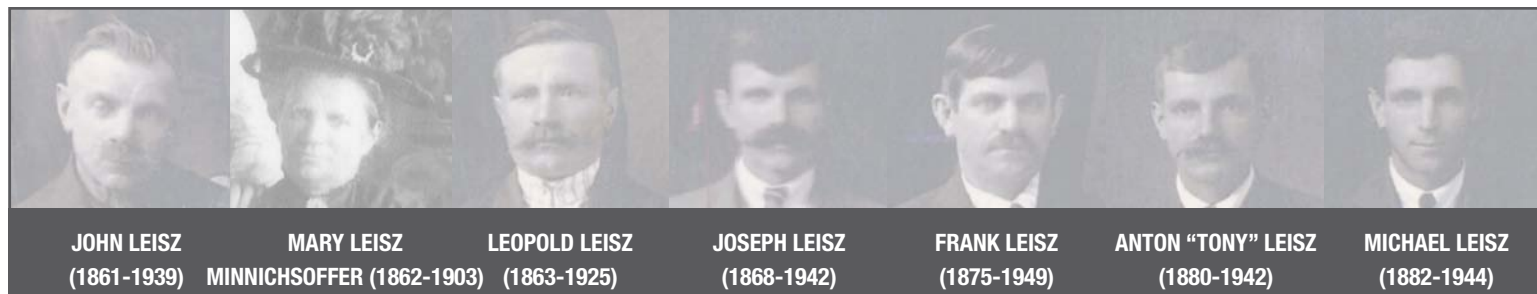

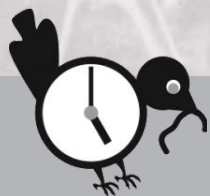

## A VERY special anniversary

The year 2018 marks the 100th anniversary of the death of Annamaria Schmidt Leisz, who immigrated from Europe to the United States in 1893 with her sons and daughters. Today her descendants number more than 1,000. If you're receiving this special mailing, you are one of them.

Born just north of Vienna, Austria on June 14, 1840, Annamaria was a courageous, stalwart woman who bore 12 children with husband Leopold Leisz (b. 1835), lost four of them in infancy or early childhood, then was widowed in 1893. She left her village of Nemetperg, Romania (today known as Peregu Mare), immigrated to America with her children, and started a new life in northern Wisconsin. An early settler of Turtle Lake in Barron County, Annamaria lived there nearly 25 years before she died on July 31, 1918 at age 78. She is buried in the cemetery at St. Ann's Roman Catholic Church in Turtle Lake.

DID YOU KNOW?

This lady was born in 1840 in Europe. She had 12 children with her husband before he died tragically in a tavern fire in 1883.

After being widowed, she and her 8 living children immigrated to America, stopping for a time in Chicago, and then relocating to rural Turtle Lake, Wisconsin.

An early settler of Turtle Lake, she toiled to help her 6 sons, 1 daughter, and their families to make a living through farming.

When she died on July 31, 1918 in Turtle Lake, this woman had 43 grandchildren and 13 great grandchildren. **YOU ARE HER DESCENDANT.**
