Frank Leisz, 74, pioneer resident of the Turtle Lake community passed away at his home Saturday, October 22, following a ten months illness due to heart trouble and dropsy.

Frank Leisz was born April April 30, 1875, in Hungary, the son of John and Mary Leisz. He came to Wisconsin in 1893. Six years later, in 1899, he was united in marriage to Barbara Donaker and they have lived in this community ever since, operating a farm southeast of the village for several years before moving into town. Six children were born to this union, one of whom, Frank, preceded him in death in 1931.

He had served as Town Treasurer, treasurer of St. Ann Catholic church, and was active in school and community affairs. He was a member of the Family Protective Association.

Mr. Leisz was a quiet family man, and was always willing to be of assistance to his neighbors and friends.

Funeral services were held on Tuesday, October 25, at 9:00 A. M. at the St. Ann Catholic church, with Father Bohle officiating at the Requiem High Mass, assisted by the St. Ann Choir. Burial was in the St. Ann Cemetery. Pallbearers were Joe Leisz, Jacob Donaker, Joe Minnischaffer, Edward Leisz, Tony Leisz, and Andrew Leisz.

He leaves to mourn his passing, his wife, Barbara, two daughters, Mrs. L. Podd, Port Arthur, Ontario, Canada, Mrs. Ed Baltozer, Evansville, Indiana, three sons, Tony of Clear Lake, Wis., Joe of Minneapolis, and Mike of Turtle Lake, fifteen grandchildren, and a host of friends.
