

For those who weren't in attendance Monday speakers were GFWC International President Deb Strahanoski and Congressman Andy Kim who spoke about volunteerism and the impact on our communities. Bylaws were approved and Best All-Around Reporting Awards were given in 7 categories.

Monday night the EX Clubs were honored along with five amazing Women of Achievement for their outstanding accomplishments here in NJ: **Shanel Y. 


