GENERAL (Non-Destination Specific)(17):

Title: **COMMANDING A WARSHIP**

Summary: While not quite as glamorous as a cruise ship, a warship is a powerhouse on the water - fast, formidable and crucial for protecting our oceans and the freedom of navigation we sometimes forget we rely on. Join Admiral Simon Hardern for a rare, insider look at life on the high seas as a Royal Navy Commanding Officer. He'll share tales from global hotbeds like the Indian Ocean and Persian Gulf and even give you the chance to ask anything about the Royal Navy or life at sea.

Title: **NAVAL TRADITIONS AND ETIQUETTE**

Summary: Most naval services around the world run on good order, discipline, and a healthy dose of tradition - because let's face it, without them, things would probably descend into chaos (and not the fun kind). Join Simon Hardern as he takes you on a sometimes-irreverent tour through thirty of the more unusual and hilarious naval traditions, all from the perspective of someone who's lived through them for 34 years. Get ready for a few laughs, some eye-rolls, and maybe even a surprise or two - because naval etiquette isn't always as buttoned-up as it seems.

Title: **HOW SHIPS AVOID COLLISIONS AND GROUNDINGS - THE RULES OF THE ROAD FOR THE OCEANS!**

Summary: This enrichment talk explains how modern ships safely share some of the busiest waterways on Earth. Using clear examples, Simon Hardern introduces the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (COLREGs), the global 'rules of the road' that govern right-of-way, lights, shapes, and sound signals in all conditions of visibility. It explores how bridge teams combine training, judgement and technology with pilotage, traffic separation schemes, buoyage and vessel traffic services to manage risk. Real-world scenarios - head-on, crossing, and night navigation - show how accidents are avoided, and why professionalism on the bridge is critical to passenger safety.

Title: **MAPPING THE WORLD'S OCEANS (HOW A CRUISE SHIP NAVIGATES WITHOUT HITTING SOMETHING)(CAN BE ADAPTED TO ANY CRUISE DESTINATION BY OCEAN/SEA)**

Summary: Did you know that only 28% of the world's oceans have been surveyed to modern standards? And that we know more about the Moon or Mars than we do about the seabed beneath our feet? If we tried to map the oceans like Google maps our streets, it would take a mind-boggling 600 years! Simon Hardern takes you on a wild ride from the days of paper

charts (where finding your way felt like an ancient treasure hunt) to today's high-tech world where cruise ships are practically guided by magic GPS. But wait, the future is even more exciting - imagine a bridge of the future where navigation is so interactive, even the captain might have to fight for the best seat!

Title: GLOBAL WARMING IMPACT ON SEA LEVELS (CAN BE ADAPTED TO ANY CRUISE DESTINATION BY OCEAN/SEA)

Summary: In this presentation, Simon Hardern explores how our planet is warming at the fastest rate in recorded history, with 2024 marking the first-year global temperatures exceeded 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels. We examine the key drivers of climate change, the accelerating rise in sea levels, the dramatic loss of Arctic ice and the increasingly severe weather events affecting millions worldwide. Through clear data, vivid visuals, and real-world examples, we uncover how climate change is reshaping ecosystems, economies and human health. Finally, we look at future projections, tipping points, and the urgent actions - from local initiatives to global cooperation - needed to secure a sustainable future.

Title: A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE CRUISE SHIP INDUSTRY

Summary: Welcome aboard, fellow adventurers! In this whirlwind cruise through time, Simon Hardern will sail you from the stately steamers of the 1800s - when 'all-inclusive' meant surviving the voyage - to today's floating cities with Wi-Fi faster than the wind. We'll meet famous ships, a few icebergs, and plenty of innovation, all while peeking at the future of zero-emission, AI-powered ocean wanderers. Think of it as 200 years of maritime madness packed into one breezy voyage - no seasickness tablets required!

Title: THE EVOLUTION OF SHIPBUILDING

Summary: From wooden wonders that burned faster than they sailed to today's billion-dollar floating cities with robot bartenders, this journey through 175 years of shipbuilding proves one thing: humans never stop tinkering with things that float. Simon Hardern steers you from clippers and clanking ironclads to the leviathans of the cruise era- complete with laser-cut steel, Azipods and Wi-Fi at sea (because heaven forbid we miss a dog video mid-Atlantic). It's a voyage of invention, disaster, and triumph - where the unsinkable sometimes sinks, the unimaginable sails and the shipyard always smells faintly of paint and optimism.

Title: THE ANATOMY OF A CRUISE SHIP - UNDERSTANDING WHAT MAKES IT ALL WORK

Summary: Ever wandered the decks, spotted a mysterious dome, aerial, or funnel gadget, and thought, 'is that important ... or just decorative?' Join Simon Hardern for a good-humoured session that lifts the lid on the strange, wonderful and occasionally baffling features hiding in plain sight around a cruise ship. From the 'golf balls' beaming TV shows from space to the quiet heroes keeping passengers safe, connected and freshly ventilated, you'll finally know what you're looking at. No engineering degree required -just curiosity, a sense of fun, and perhaps the ability to pretend you always knew this stuff.

Title: 20 GREAT MARITIME EXPERIENCES

Summary: A sweeping journey through the world's most compelling waterways, in this presentation Simon Hardern curates 20 extraordinary maritime experiences across rivers, lakes, canals and ocean extremes. It blends natural wonder, human history and engineering achievement, from the Amazon's vast flow and the Nile's ancient civilisations to the Panama and Suez canals that reshaped global trade. Inland seas and remote passages reveal scale, isolation and geopolitical significance, while polar routes and storm-lashed capes showcase the ocean at its most powerful. It is designed to inspire curiosity, enriches understanding and highlights how voyages by water can transform perspective, connecting landscapes, cultures and history in unforgettable ways.

Title: HOW DRONES AND AI ARE CHANGING MODERN WARFARE

Summary: The battlefield has changed forever - and the effects are being felt far beyond the front line. In this presentation, Simon Hardern explores how a £200 drone can defeat a £4 million missile system, how artificial intelligence is making life-and-death targeting decisions in real time, and why Houthi rebels in Yemen brought global shipping to its knees. From Ukraine's drone laboratories to laser weapons that fire at the speed of light - this is modern warfare as it's actually being fought today. Thought-provoking, timely, and closer to home than you might think.

Title: THE WORLD IN 2046 - STORMS, SHIFTS AND SURPRISING HOPE

Summary: While you're sailing the oceans, the world beyond the horizon is changing fast. By 2046, new trade routes open in the Arctic, technology reshapes daily life, power shifts toward the Indo-Pacific, and climate redraws coastlines. Supply chains stretch and harden, space becomes contested, and geopolitics grows more complex. But it's not all turbulence. Innovation accelerates, health improves, clean energy advances and new partnerships emerge. In this talk, Simon Hardern explores what the next twenty years may bring - not with alarm, but with perspective ... because understanding tomorrow's world makes today's journey even more fascinating.

Title: WHAT ON EARTH?! - FACTS THAT WILL REWIRE YOUR BRAIN

Summary: From the crushing depths of the ocean beneath your feet to the farthest edges of the observable universe, the world is stranger, bigger and more wonderful than most of us ever stop to notice. In this presentation, Simon Hardern takes you on a tour of genuinely mind-bending facts across space, the human body, animals, history, psychology, food, technology, geography, and language - including words for feelings you've always had but never been able to name. Along the way there are quiz rounds, record-breakers, and a few facts that will make you look at everyday things - strawberries, carrots, your own reflection - completely differently!

Title: HOW NATO WORKS

Summary: Since its formation in 1949, the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) has shaped global security, from ending the Cold War to leading counter-terror campaigns in Iraq, Afghanistan, and Libya. Today, the Alliance faces fresh challenges, with Euro-Atlantic security threatened by strategic competition and instability - none more pressing than the Russian Federation's direct threat to Allied security. With 32 member nations, every decision NATO makes requires consensus (yes, it's as complicated as it sounds!). In this behind-the-scenes presentation, Admiral Simon Hardern reveals how NATO navigates military and political complexities to safeguard the democratic freedoms we too often take for granted.

Title: THE INTERNET'S UNDERWORLD AND CRYPTO CURRENCY - MYTH VERSUS REALITY

Summary: What lies beneath the internet we use every day? In this revealing talk, Simon Hardern explores the hidden world of the Dark Web and Crypto Currency - the marketplaces, myths and modern crimes that rarely make the full headlines. From the rise of Bitcoin and secret online bazaars to ransomware, romance scams and cyber investigations, this is a beginners guide to a digital underworld that affects us more than we might think. Sensational in reputation, often misunderstood in reality - he separates fact from fiction and uncovers how this shadowy realm quietly touches our everyday lives.

Title: MANAGING AIRLINE CRASH RESPONSES - HUMAN RESILIENCE WHEN THE UNTHINKABLE HAPPENS

Summary: Flying might be the safest way to travel (next to cruising, of course!), but airlines prepare meticulously for the rare chance of an accident. From planning for 'non-normal' events to managing the aftermath, Simon Hardern takes you behind the scenes of aviation safety. Drawing from his firsthand experiences supporting crash responses in the USA and the southern Pacific, he shares powerful stories of human courage, compassion, and resilience. This isn't just about crisis management - it's about the extraordinary hope that emerges even in the darkest moments.

Title: THE NEW SILK ROAD

Summary: Since 2013, China's New Silk Road has been remaking the global map with railways, highways, ports, and pipelines stretching across 150+ countries. It promises to revive ancient trade routes, but with its potential to boost global trade comes a fair share of controversy. Simon Hardern takes you on a journey through this colossal project, unpacking the strategic concerns it raises for Western democracies and how it's reshaping the Far East and Pacific. Is it a trade revolution or a geopolitical chess move? Tune in to find out!

Title: BRICS - BRAZIL, RUSSIA, INDIA, CHINA, SOUTH AFRICA - THE BLOC RESHAPING GLOBAL POWER

Summary: BRICS (Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa) is a club that began with four giant nations - Brazil, Russia, India and China- who realised they were far too big, loud and ambitious to sit quietly at the back of the global classroom. Later, they invited South Africa, and now half the world seems to be queuing up to join, like it's the hottest nightclub in geopolitics. Together they represent massive populations, booming economies and the occasional disagreement conducted with impressive politeness. Love them or puzzle over them, Simon Hardern will cover how BRICS is reshaping global power - and doing it without any official headquarters, dress code or even matching stationery.

Africa (5):

Title: THE CAPE OF GOOD HOPE - GATEWAY TO ADVENTURE AND HISTORY

Summary: A pivotal landmark during the Age of Exploration, this iconic site symbolises both hope and peril for early sailors. Renowned for its notorious weather - shaped by the dramatic interplay of ocean currents, powerful winds, and rugged geography - it vividly embodies why it earned the nickname 'Cape of Storms.' Simon Hardern will provide tales of shipwrecks to bring to life the human drama of navigating its treacherous waters. Beyond its formidable history, the Cape showcases stunning biodiversity, from its unique fynbos vegetation to its charismatic wildlife, leaving audiences captivated by the awe-inspiring wonder of this legendary destination.

Title: THE WAR AT SEA OFF THE SOUTHERN TIP OF AFRICA - WW1 AND WW2

Summary: The waters surrounding the southern tip of Africa, dominated by the Cape of Good Hope, have historically been of immense strategic importance. This region served as a vital maritime crossroads for trade routes connecting Europe, Asia, and the Americas. During both World Wars, the seas off southern Africa became theatres of intense naval activity, characterised by convoy battles, submarine warfare and the strategic deployment of naval bases. These conflicts underscored the region's significance as both a chokepoint for global shipping and a critical supply line. Simon Hardern covers these issues in this presentation.

Title: GATEWAY TO CONTINENTS - THE STRATEGIC IMPORTANCE OF SOUTHERN AFRICA

Summary: In this talk, Simon Hardern explores why Southern Africa has held extraordinary strategic importance for centuries, controlling one of the world's most vital maritime

crossroads. The speaker examines how the Cape Sea Route shaped global trade, naval power, and European exploration long before the Suez Canal existed. Guests learn how the region's geography, winds and currents influenced navigation, why Cape Town became a critical victualling and military hub, and how modern shipping still relies on these waters today. The talk also highlights mineral wealth, choke points, and emerging geopolitical dynamics. It's an accessible, visually rich session with strong appeal for history-minded cruise guests.

Title: ANGOLA - COASTLINES, CULTURE AND COMEBACKS

Summary: This talk introduces guests to Angola, one of Africa's most intriguing and least understood nations. Simon Hardern explores Angola's dramatic Atlantic coastline, rich cultural traditions and globally influential music, before examining the country's vast natural resources - especially oil and diamonds - that shape its modern economy. The session explains Angola's complex colonial history, its long civil war and its remarkable transformation since 2002 as Luanda emerges as a rapidly growing capital. Guests also gain insight into Angola's wildlife, national parks and unique blend of African and Portuguese heritage. It's an accessible, balanced and highly informative introduction for travellers visiting the region.

Title: NAMIBIA - DESERTS, DIAMONDS AND THE SKELETON COAST

Summary: This talk presents an engaging introduction to Namibia, one of Africa's most striking and diverse destinations. Simon Hardern explores the vast Namib Desert - the world's oldest - along with the towering dunes of Sossusvlei, the wildlife-rich Etosha plains and the haunting shipwrecks of the Skeleton Coast. He also examines Namibia's diamond and mineral wealth, its unique German colonial legacy and the cultural heritage of peoples such as the Himba and Herero. Guests also learn how Namibia became a pioneer in community-based conservation. Visually rich and easy to follow, it offers travellers an excellent foundation for understanding this remarkable Atlantic nation.

Antarctica (4):

Title: ANTARCTICA AND THE CRUISE SHIP CONUNDRUM - WONDERS AND WORRIES

Summary: Cruise ships in the Antarctic - sounds like an adventure, right? More people are getting the chance to experience the frozen beauty of this remote continent, but it's not all snowflakes and scenic vistas. Simon Hardern dives into the rising concerns about how this surge in cruise traffic could harm the delicate ecosystem - pollution, wildlife disruption, and even the dreaded risk of oil spills. Join him as he navigates the challenges and efforts being made by the international community to keep Antarctica pristine for future generations.

Title: WHERE OCEANS MEET - EXPLORING THE SOUTHERN STRAITS AT THE EDGE OF THE WORLD

Summary: Simon Hardern explore three of the most dramatic waterways on Earth - the Strait of Magellan, the Beagle Channel and the Drake Passage. These have shaped 500 years of exploration, from Magellan and Drake to Darwin aboard HMS Beagle. They remain vital gateways for global trade, rich wildlife habitats and key routes for Antarctic travel. You'll discover their fierce winds, complex navigation, indigenous history and pivotal role in climate science. As he follows in the wake of great explorers, he will let you experience these legendary waters in comfort - yet still with a sense of wonder and respect.

Title: SHACKLETON'S ENDURANCE - THE ANTARCTIC CRUISE THAT REALLY WENT SOUTH!

Summary: Imagine booking a cruise where the ice doesn't chill your drink but it eats your ship. Sir Ernest Shackleton and 27 very cold friends spent two years proving that teamwork, optimism and an alarming fondness for penguin stew can conquer almost anything (except the Weddell Sea). They drifted, rowed and climbed their way into history - with zero Wi-Fi, one heroic carpenter, and a cat named Mrs Chippy who turned out to be a bloke. It's the ultimate tale of grit, leadership under pressure and never, ever buying the 'adventure package.' Join Simon Hardern for this amazing tale.

Title: ANTARCTIC BASES - SCIENCE, SURVIVAL, AND THE SPIRIT OF EXPLORATION

Summary: The Antarctic Peninsula is one of the most extraordinary places on Earth - a frozen frontier where human curiosity, courage and cooperation thrive. Here, scientists from over 20 nations work side-by-side in extreme conditions to unlock secrets of climate, oceans, wildlife, and our planet's future. These remote bases are more than research stations; they are symbols of resilience, ingenuity and global unity. From pioneering discoveries to remarkable human stories, this is science at the edge of the world. Join Simon Hardern as he reveals the hidden world behind the buildings you may see (or not), and why what happens here matters to us all.

Asia (13):

Title: CAPITALS OF JAPAN THROUGH HISTORY - FROM WANDERING COURTS TO MEGACITY

Summary: Join Simon Hardern on a journey through Japan's remarkable parade of capitals. Before Tokyo, the imperial court moved whenever an emperor died - death being spiritually polluting in Shinto belief. Nara lasted 74 years before Buddhist monks grew dangerously powerful. Kyoto endured for an extraordinary 1,074 years, surviving shoguns, civil war and repeated burning before being quietly replaced in 1868. Edo became the world's largest city almost by accident. Tokyo reigns today - though events could always lead Japan to make that decision one more time.

Title: JAPAN'S AUTOMOTIVE REVOLUTION

Summary: In the wreckage of post-war Japan, a few determined engineers turned scarcity into strategy - and built an empire on efficiency. From Toyota's Just-in-Time genius to Honda's motorcycle-to-motorcar leap, Japan transformed "cheap and cheerful" into 'crafted and reliable.' Kaizen replaced chaos; perfection became a process. By the 1980s, Japan wasn't just building cars - it was teaching the world how to build anything properly. From rusty factories rose Lexus luxury, Prius hybrids, and a philosophy that made every worker a quality guru. It's not just manufacturing - it's a masterclass in turning limits into legends.

Title: THE SOUTH KOREAN SUCCESS STORY

Summary: Imagine a country flattened by war, poorer than most of Africa in the 1950s, now selling you your smartphone, TV and favourite Netflix binge. That's South Korea - the 'Miracle on the Han River.' Guided by vision, discipline, and perhaps an industrial-strength work ethic, it morphed from rice paddies to microchips, dictatorships to democracy, and now leads the world in tech, pop culture, and skincare. BTS, Hyundai, and Samsung didn't just happen - they were planned. Join Simon Hardern as traces how kimchi met capitalism and created a cultural and economic powerhouse unlike any other.

Title: DRAGONS, DATA AND DESTINY - HOW CHINA IS RESHAPING OUR WORLD

Summary: Step into the story of modern China, a nation rising at breathtaking speed and reshaping the 21st-century world. From high-speed trains and lunar missions to AI breakthroughs, megacities, clean-energy revolutions and the complex dance of cooperation and rivalry with the United States, this presentation reveals the forces driving today's global transformation. Simon Hardern explores astonishing engineering feats, remarkable scientific achievements, and the strategic ambitions powering China's future. Title: FREEDOM OF NAVIGATION IN THE SOUTH CHINA SEA

Summary: The South China Sea is like the world's most valuable - and contested - traffic jam, where strategic location meets vast oil and gas riches. The concept of 'Freedom of Navigation' is at the heart of the tension between China and the USA, governed by international law, but often easier said than followed. Title: US AND CHINESE NAVIES - FIRST AMONGST EQUALS

Title: RESPONDING TO THE 2004 BOXING DAY INDIAN OCEAN TSUNAMI

Summary: Following 9.1 magnitude earthquake 18 miles below the ocean floor between the Burma and Indian Plates on Boxing Day 2004, the resulting massive tsunami caused waves up to 30 m (100 ft) high. It devastated communities along the surrounding coasts of the Indian Ocean, killing an estimated 227,898 people in 14 countries in one of the deadliest natural disasters in recorded history. In this fascinating presentation, Simon Hardern recounts the scope of the disaster response and the significant challenges rescuers faced with the incident response given the overwhelming number of deceased personnel as well as the critical lessons learned.

Title: INDONESIA - ISLANDS OF FIRE, SPICE AND GLOBAL SEAFARING HISTORY

Summary: This talk presents Indonesia as one of the world's most remarkable archipelagos, stretching across 17,000 islands and multiple cultures. Simon Hardern examines Indonesia's volcanic Ring of Fire, its legendary spice-trade heritage and its powerful influence on global exploration. Guests learn about Bali's cultural traditions, Java's ancient temples, the biodiversity of Komodo and the deep maritime connections that shaped the nation's history. The talk also highlights Indonesia's modern growth, its linguistic and ethnic diversity and the continuing importance of its islands to regional trade. The session offers guests a rich, colourful and accessible introduction to this extraordinary nation.

Title: MALAYSIA - CROSSROADS OF CULTURES, RAINFORESTS AND RISING CITIES

Summary: This talk introduces guests to Malaysia as one of Southeast Asia's most vibrant cultural crossroads. Simon Hardern explores how Malay, Chinese, Indian and Indigenous traditions have shaped the country's cuisine, religion and festivals, creating a uniquely diverse national identity. The session highlights Malaysia's spectacular rainforests, wildlife-rich national parks, and the dramatic landscapes of Borneo. It also covers the growth of Kuala Lumpur as a modern Asian hub and Malaysia's historic maritime role in the Strait of Malacca. Engaging and visually rich, the talk gives travellers a clear and accessible foundation before exploring this dynamic and welcoming nation.

Title: MALACCA - THE NARROW STRAIT THAT SHAPES THE WORLD

Summary: In this talk, Simon Hardern takes you on a fast-moving voyage through the Strait of Malacca - a 550-mile bottleneck that quietly keeps the modern world running. A quarter of global trade squeezes through this narrow passage between Malaysia and Sumatra, feeding the economies of East Asia and powering global supply chains. Simon Hardern explores its colourful past of sultans, traders, and pirates, and the modern challenges of crowded waters, monsoons, and environmental strain. With Singapore as its powerhouse guardian, the Strait remains indispensable. Simon also looks ahead to autonomous ships, cyber risks and climate pressures shaping its future.

Title: SRI LANKA - CROSSROADS OF TRADE, TEMPLES AND TEA

Summary: This talk explores Sri Lanka's unique blend of ancient civilisation, colonial history and stunning natural beauty. Simon Hardern traces the island's role in the Indian Ocean trade networks that brought merchants, spices and religions from across Asia. Guests discover the cultural treasures of Anuradhapura and Kandy, the wildlife of Yala and Udawalawe and the tea-growing highlands shaped by British influence. The talk also reflects on Sri Lanka's more recent history, recovery and modern identity. With strong appeal for travellers, the session highlights the island's warmth, resilience and extraordinary heritage, offering an ideal introduction before visiting this enchanting destination.

Caribbean/Central America (7):

Title: THE BERMUDA TRIANGLE - MYTH VERSUS REALITY

Summary: Join Simon Hardern as he sails straight into the Bermuda Triangle - because what could possibly go wrong? We'll trace how a perfectly ordinary patch of ocean became the world's most notorious vortex of vanishing ships, confused pilots and over-excited authors. From Columbus spotting weird lights to Flight 19 disappearing faster than your phone signal at sea, we'll separate the spooky from the scientific. Was it aliens, Atlantis, or just bad navigation and even worse weather? Expect mysterious tales, dubious theories, and a few compass jokes. Title: **THE CHILEAN TSUNAMI WARNING SYSTEM - SUPERHERO OF THE PACIFIC**

Title: THE SINKING OF HMS ROYAL OAK AT SCAPA FLOW - THE FIRST GREAT BRITISH NAVAL DISASTER OF WORLD WAR 2

Summary: In October 1939, the British battleship HMS ROYAL OAK was sunk at the Royal Navy's Home Fleet (supposedly) fortress anchorage of Scapa Flow in Orkney by a torpedo attack from the German submarine U-47. Over 800 sailors lost their life when the ship sunk; it had a considerable effect on British wartime morale just two months into the start of World War 2. Simon Hardern will recount the story of this audacious attack and how, even today, each year the Royal Navy commemorates the fate of those who died in the service of their nation.

Title: THE VOYAGE OF THE DAMNED - FROM DOGGER BANK TO TSUSHIMA - 1904-1905

Summary: Join Simon Hardern for this gripping retelling of one of naval history's most extraordinary odysseys. Follow Russia's ill-fated Baltic Fleet on its epic 18,000-mile voyage to the Far East - plagued by paranoia, blunders and tragedy. From the farcical Dogger Bank incident in the North Sea to the devastating Battle of Tsushima Straits against the Japanese Imperial Fleet, discover how pride, poor leadership and endurance shaped this 'voyage of the damned.' A true story of ambition, folly, and transformation at sea that would change the balance of power in Asia - and the course of naval warfare - forever.

Title: WRECKS, RUIN AND REMARKABLE TALES - 200 YEARS OF MARITIME DRAMA AROUND BRITAIN AND IRELAND
