


Meeting with local libraries and schools to discuss future projects (book readings/give-away, craft projects)

Days for Girls 2025

Dear Wonderful Ladies of Altrusa Int'l of San Luis Obispo County:

Two weeks ago (January 13), we drove 654 Days for Girls Kits--paid for in large part by Altrusa Int'l of San Luis Obispo, County!--in 13 crates to Long Beach, California, and hand-delivered them to Bob Sykes, one of the founders of San Diego's Loloma Foundation Medical Missions to the Fiji & Solomon Islands. We had planned on taking 554.

kits--which were beautifully packed during our November Packing Day (at which four of your Altrusa members came up with a more productive way to pack them)! (We will ALL do it next year!) We were excited to find that we had enough components to assemble 100 extra Days for Girls Kits. Bob Sykes was especially thrilled, as was Linda Kwasny, the Managing Director in San Diego. Here's why:

This year the Loloma Medical Missions will be conducted in May & June of 2025, in the Fiji & Solomon Islands where they have held special clinics for women and girls, men, children, and dentistry on the remotest islands since 2003. Between clinics, special distributions will be held at each of these sites for distributing 554 of our Days for Girls Kits. Each recipient is trained to care for her kit to get the most life out of it. Prior to receiving the DfG kits, the girls and women are tutored in the biology of menses, how to protect themselves from disease and abuse, and how to manage pregnancy. In answer to the "WHY" above: This year Loloma volunteers moved the surgery clinic to a more centralized location in the remotest islands so they can bring patients to the center rather than having to move the center. This will improve intensive medical care and facilitate urgently needed surgeries for the most impoverished islanders. The American medical volunteers are very much dependent upon support of the locals to carry out their missions, and the 100 extra kits will be a boon. Loloma is delighted to have them to distribute among local Fijian women to help promote their support of the new surgery center.

As I think you at Altrusa know, our dedicated, hard-working sew-ers of the San Luis Obispo DfG Team couldn't do it without your support. It was an extra delight to have your members help us pack again, and we are deeply indebted to Altrusa for your generous support of our team. Still more indebted are all the women and girls of the remotest Fiji & Solomon Islands who thank you from the bottom of their hearts for newfound freedom and dignity as they gain a clean, safe way to handle one of the most basic functions of human biology. You are all angels at Altrusa SLO. We hope you know that. The DfG kit surely recipients do!

A few members of our **San Luis Obispo DfG Team** meet from **9:30 to Noon** every Monday at the Lutheran Church (**4500 El Camino, Atasc.**) and every Wednesday in Brenda Earle's garage workshop (**875 Grapevine, Templeton**) to sew. Altrusa members are welcome to join us at any of these sessions. However, most SLO DfG team sew-ers sew in their own homes from San Miguel clear down to Nipomo. We drive a lot delivering supplies and picking up sewn components! We will be heading down to Nipomo soon in case you need me to pick up that DfG banner and stand. Hope it was useful! :)
