



Pastor's Message: Do I Give Something Up or Add Something To?

We are still in the season of Epiphany (at least until Sunday, February 4th). Last month, I encouraged us to, in the spirit of Epiphany, share the light of Christ with others, to lift high the Cross of Christ in our lives to draw others to Him. In other words, let our lights shine for Him!

But we will soon start the season of Lent. And often times, during the Lent season we are encouraged to **GIVE SOMETHING UP** for Lent. This indeed may be an honorable practice, and may well help contribute to our spiritual disciple as we reflect on the life and death of Christ in preparation for Easter. I could certainly encourage that.

But there is another idea that I have suggested to others in their spiritual walk with Christ during this time of Lent. During this Lenten season, consider **ADDING SOMETHING TO** your Lenten journey!

Specifically, continuing with the Epiphany focus, consider adding the idea of being, by God's Grace, a witness to Christ as we go about our daily lives. This can be the **ADDING SOMETHING TO** our Lenten experience.

I'm going to share in this Newsletter article what I shared this past Sunday in my sermon. The idea that we have experienced the Grace and Love in Christ in our lives, out of thankfulness we joyfully respond to be open to the opportunities that the Lord provides for us to be Christ for others.

On Tuesday, January 23rd, I was at a restaurant with my son having breakfast. After we received our food, we paused and said the common table prayer. And then the waitress came by to fill our coffee cups. Out of the blue (believe me I don't normally do this!), I asked her, "If I may ask, what is your first name?" She responded, "Lisa". I then said, "Lisa, normally before partaking of our food, we usually have a prayer. And I was kind of wondering if there was anything that I can pray about for you?"

Lisa's eyes suddenly began welling up with tears. And she blurted out, "Yes, my Grandpa Carl just found out that he has stage 3 cancer and he lost his brother a month ago. This has been a difficult time in our family." I then said a prayer for her Grandpa Carl, and her and her family. Once again, tears were welling up in her eyes. She thanked me at least twice after that as we continued with our breakfast.

The point of all this, is that we never know how Spirit moves in our lives to be Christ to others. I am asking that we just consider being open to the Holy Spirit's work in our lives for the benefit of others. This is one way of **ADDING SOMETHING TO** our season of Lent!
