



Pastor's Message: The Gospel in a Nutshell

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." [ESV]

I am thrilled to be St. Peter's Vacancy Pastor. I have certainly enjoyed and appreciated getting to know the members. Some I have known actually for several years in another context. I thought I would start my first newsletter article with the basics – John 3:16. John 3:16 is a simple yet profound message, the foundation of who we are as Christians and the foundation of any Christian church.

Jarvis J. Williams, associate professor of New Testament interpretation at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary and a pastor at Sojourn Church Midtown in Louisville, Kentucky, said this in an article in the April 2023 edition of the magazine "Christianity Today", p.61: "John 3:16 sustains me now. It reminds me God's love is rooted in His own sacrificial action in Jesus. The truth of John 3:16 is important when we feel unloved and unwelcomed. We may feel that way before we know Jesus. But the verse is also an important truth to encourage us in the middle of our walk with Jesus and when we come to the end of our lives."

I was intrigued by this article. Here we have a New Testament scholar writing a lengthy article on the importance of John 3:16! When I was in confirmation class, I remember my Pastor Pasche explaining that this verse in the Bible could be called "the Gospel in a nutshell." The reason for this, he would explain, was that the entire message of Scripture is contained in this one verse of the Bible.

Such a simple and yet a totally profound verse of Scripture as Professor Williams discovered and expounded upon! I would like to share just a few thoughts about this verse.

"For God so loved..." the verb "to love" in the original language of Greek in its noun form is Agape. The normal meaning refers to one loved another with a total self-sacrificing unconditional type of love. John uses it 36 times in his Gospel, significantly more than Matthew, Mark or Luke. In 1 John, he uses it 31 times. Luke is the next highest with 13 times. John is so determined to help his readers understand what the tremendous, overwhelming love that God has for people. Love that found its full expression in the sacrificial death of the lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world by that death and affirmed through his actual resurrection from the dead.

"....only son..." According to Leon Morris, author of his classic commentary <u>The Gospel According to John</u> states that the word here for "only" (only, only-begotten, unique), appearing but 9 times in the New Testament is applied to Christ only by John. John uses a special word for a special person - Jesus Christ!

"That whoever believes in him..." John uses the verb "to believe" something like 98 times (Matthew 11 times, Mark 14 times, Luke 9 times, Acts 37 times, Paul 54 times). But here is an even more significant observation, He likes to combine it with the preposition "in" which means literally "into". He does this combining 36 times.

Stanley Porter, his book, <u>Idioms Of The Greek New Testament</u>, suggests that one is to think of a ball going "into" a box to get the idea of what "into" in the original language literally means. So, if we would literally translate what John is saying, "that whoever believes INTO Christ has eternal life". This implies a personal relationship. Believing INTO Christ!

That is exactly what John is suggesting. An intimate, close relationship indeed! The mystical union of Christ with the believer as Paul would emphasize in his epistles. Leon Morris, his commentary on the Gospel of John, quotes @. Turner: "The sense must be that the believer throws himself upon his Lord in loving, self-abandoning faith and trust."


I am all for the personal, close relationship with the Savior. But we must also understand that we have nothing to do with it. It is a state of who we are because of the Holy Spirit who brings and keeps us in the faith. "No one can say Jesus is Lord, except by the Holy Spirit" (1 Cor. 12:3).

The Holy Spirit through the Word of God - the Bible - brings and keeps us in this personal, close, intimate relationship with our Lord and Savior. That is why we are eager to spend time, daily time, in His Word to realize the deeper meaning and realization of the abundant and eternal life that our Lord provided for us through His death and His resurrection.

John 3:16. The Gospel in a nutshell. So simple and yet so profound!
