Parkland Rules

Parkland is available for the enjoyment of all of the Village residents and is managed by the Parks and Paths, Deerhead Hammock, Nutting-Wood Green and Erna Nixon Committees. A map is available in the AHF Office.

General Rules:

- The parklands are available for the enjoyment of all Melbourne Village residents. All plants and animals in the parklands are protected.
- In order to keep the park areas clean and pleasant for walking, nothing should be dumped or stored on parkland or pathways. If you should find litter, please carry it out. Leave only footprints.
- Mowing and planting may be done only with the consent of the BOT.
 Such requests should be submitted to the Parks and Paths, Erna Nixon Hammock, Nutting-Wood Green, or Deerhead Hammock Committee, as appropriate, for consideration and recommendation to the Board.
- Vehicles may park in the area adjacent to these community facilities: AHF Hall and Community Pool.
- No motorized vehicles are permitted on any parkland.
- Bicycles are permitted and riders are asked to ride with caution and be courteous to pedestrians.
- Clothes lines, trash, and compost containers should be kept within the resident's lot boundaries.
- Burning and smoking are not permitted on parklands. Fire is a hazard to our wildlife, trees, and homes.
- While enjoying the paths and parklands, be careful not to stray onto private property which in some places is very close or adjacent to the park.
- To the degree practical and feasible, AHF committees having the responsibility for the management of AHF lands are authorized and encouraged to remove or cause to be removed exotic and invasive species which have been so designated by the Florida Exotic Pest Plant Council.
