Karen Bentley, Wesnet CEO has a particular interest in the intersection of technology and Violence Against Women and is regularly called upon to provide advice to governments, policy makers and technology companies.

Karen has trained thousands about technology safety and is a co-founder of the Safety Net Australia project. Karen has also worked as a consultant to numerous non-government organisations and in leadership positions in the health sector. She is passionate about ensuring gender equality and ending violence.

Susie Rowe, developed a passion for working on refugee and migrant issues when teaching English as a Second Language.
