RULES & REGULATIONS

General

- The Society has for its objects the promotion of the interests of industry in general, and for agricultural and kindred crafts in particular, and of the public health. The Committee reserve to themselves power to withhold or modify any of the premiums where exhibits in their, or the opinion of the Judges are not of sufficient merit or where there is no competition.
- A separate entry must be made for every prize competed for.
- Entries to be submitted in writing.
- The violation by any Exhibitor of the Rules and Regulations will involve the forfeiture of all premiums awarded to him, or such portion thereof as the Committee may determine, and shall also be in the power of the Committee to debar such exhibitor from competing at any future Exhibition of the Society.
- No responsibility will be incurred by the Society or it's Stewards or Servants for any loss or accident that may befall and Person or Exhibit on the Showfield. Every possible care and attention, however, will be bestowed on all exhibits.
- Protests must be lodged with the Secretary by 1pm on the day of the show, and the decision of the Committee appointed to determine these shall be final. No protest can be entertained unless a deposit of £10 has been lodged with the Secretary, which deposit shall be forfeited to the Society if the Committee consider there are no grounds for the protest.
- The Committee are not responsible for any expenses incurred due to the Show being cancelled for any reason.
- No attendant in charge of exhibits will be admitted to the Showfield without official ticket which must be produced for inspection at the gate.
- All trophies must be engraved and returned to the Show Secretary by 1st September prior to the Show. The Trophy must be returned in perfect condition. Any loss or damage to the trophy is the responsibility of the recipient.
- The Committee reserves the right to cancel any item if weather be inclement.
- All vehicles must be moved to the car park as soon as exhibits have been dropped off

Stock

- Entries taken subject to bio-security measures required on show date. Exhibitors must complete their own stock movement records.
- ACCREDITED SHEEP MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY THEIR M.V. CERTIFICATE. MV/CAE Health Declarations must be shown to the Attending Steward **PRIOR** to the unloading of stock.
- All horse entries must be accompanied with an up-to-date passport with flu vaccination. Validation must be shown at the Secretary's Tent prior to collecting number. Only fully vaccinated horses and ponies will be allowed on the showground.
- All Stock exhibited must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor and have been in his possession from 1st June, 2024 (**Stock exhibited in classes 107 -138 exempted**).
- All Ewes must have reared and nursed lambs this season, not weaned before 1st August 2024. All sheep to be bare clipped current season.
- During the Judging of Stock, no person will be allowed in the ring except the Judge and Attending Members of the Class actually being judged, and it is the duty of Attending Members to enforce this rule.
- Classes **7,14,22,29,35,80,85,92,99** exempt from Garwald Challenge Cup. Classes 36-39 are exempt as well as young Handlers Classes
- No Stock allowed to compete in more than one class except where stated in this Schedule. But any sheep from a first prize winning pair or group will be eligible to compete for Championship of Breed.
- No in-calf cow/heifer to be transported within one month of due calving date
- All stock must be placed in the Showfield by 9.00 a.m. except Horses and Ponies which should be placed by 8.15 a.m. and Dogs which should be ready for 10.15 a.m. No stock shall be removed before 3 p.m. without a written permit from the Secretary.

22. PRIZE WINNERS IN THE CLASSES FOR CATTLE, HORSES and DOGS MUST BE READY TO PARADE AT 2 pm OTHERWISE ALL RIGHTS TO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE FORFEITED.

Industrial

- Vegetables must be grown by Exhibitor
- Walking Sticks must be Exhibitor's own work
- Cakes, Scones, etc. must be baked by the Exhibitor
- Children's exhibits must state age on entry form and on the staging ticket
- Removal of all exhibits by 5pm is the responsibility of the exhibitor. The Committee will not be responsible for items which are not removed.
- All handicraft items must have been made since previous show.
