Remember

In our last Mass Book, we talked about processions and singing. We remember that singing a song to God is like praying twice. Singing together can fill people with happiness.

This week we are going to learn about incense. Incense is made up of small pieces, that looks like rocks, but when you burn them they make white smoke and a sweet smell. We place incense in a thurible. It helps make and spread the incense.

We use **incense** at Mass to represent our prayers rising up to heaven. We also use it as a sign of honor. By using it on people and sacred things, we are saying to God, "We want these things to rise up to you as well."

Is there incense at your Mass today? **Yes No** When we have incense we often us it in our opening procession, for the gospel, for communion and to bless the priest and people.
