In our last Mass Book, we talked about candles. They represent God's light to the world, our prayers, and our baptism. We use candles to help us remember to pray always.


This week we are going to learn about Liturgical Colors. These are the different colors that the priest and deacon wear at church. You might notice that they are not always the same color.

Could you imagine decorating for Easter or Christmas with Halloween decorations?

That would seem so silly. The things we see help us to prepare for what we are doing! When we see a room decorated with hearts we might think it is Valentines day. When we see balloons and streamers, we might think it is a birthday or other celebration.

The priest wears certain colors to help us to know what to expect. When we see certain colors, they mean different things.
