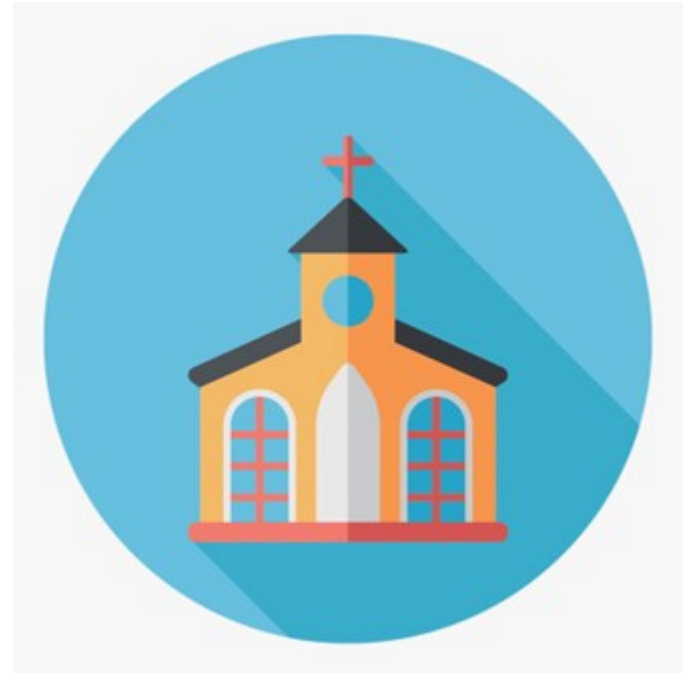
The word “Eucharist” means “Thanksgiving.”
