




## Welcome to Mapleview Market


Siblings Maya (11) and Leo (8) set up a lemonade stand but run into a problem—no one has coins!



**Think-Pair-Share:** Ask readers, "If you couldn't use money, how would you trade for a glass of lemonade?"


## **Barter Begins**

People soon exchanged paper money instead of gold. It was lighter, fit in pockets, and everyone believed the promise printed on it.




"Its just paper," he said.

Word	Kid-Friendly Meaning
Barter	Trading one thing for another without money.
Value	How much people think something is worth.
Gold Standard	Time when money notes could be swapped for a fixed amount of gold.
Receipt/ IOU	A paper promise you can exchange for something.
Blockchain	Huge digital notebook stored on many computers that keeps track of crypto coins.
Crypto (Cryptocurrency)	Digital money that uses secret math to stay secure.

#### **Parent Tips**

- Safety first: Remind older kids never to share crypto keys or online passwords.
