During this first year of operations, we have been organizing the collections room at *The House in The Park*. We have acquired acid-free paper, an accession book, and other materials necessary for record keeping. Shelves and filing cabinets are beginning to fill up with reference material and the following items:

Family Histories/Genealogies:11 family histories, 6 biographical sketches (also on file at the public library in Lockport), and 47 pedigree and family group sheets with corresponding index cards. Research Assistance has been given to 4 society members and several others via e-mail.

Monna Rowley Shares Homer Heritage

Robert Haley Compares Notes with Monna Rowley



In July 1833 the Rowleys-(with friend John Lane- inventor of the steel plow- and his family) made their way from New York via the Erie Canal to Yankee Settlement. "We fought the mosquitoes . . . launched out on the prairie . . . and

arrived at our destination 'all weary and sad.'" Monna's account reflects her family records and the *History of Will County, Illinois*, first published in 1878.

The Rowleys were one of the first pioneer families who transformed the prairie into what became the townships of Homer and Lockport.

Report Card from Wells Corner School

Wells Corner School (in session 1856-1957) was fondly remembered by several attending the program. Ruth Ingersoll Hopkins brought her father's 8th grade report card of 1921-- all superior marks, including "deportment" and "0" times tardy!

RESIDENTIAL SURVEY Shared with LAGHS

LAGHS has received a copy of a survey from the City. Approximately 153 homes and businesses and 98 other structures (mostly garages) from 6th to 15th Streets between Hamilton and Madison Streets were surveyed. The purpose of the study was to ascertain how many homes were potentially historically significant. Owners of the properties will receive a letter explaining how they might be eligible for various historic designations and what responsibilities those designations entail.

The City received a grant from the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency to commission the survey and will soon submit a grant for monies to conduct additional surveys of potential historic structures in Lockport. LAGHS is pleased to place a copy of the document in our collection.
