Chasing Your Tale—Genealogy News

Our society has been the recipient of some fascinating local family histories. In upcoming newsletters, I will share with our readers some of the genealogical history of these families.

I'd like to share with you the story of one family who has made a great impact on our community. Descendants of the original settlers and immigrants can be found among many Lockport families today.

WALTER BACKGROUND

The following account is taken from information that has come to our society from Glenn White, the great-great-grandson of Andreas Walter and Ursula Glaubin.

Included in the family history given to our society for our archives are excerpts from Michael Walter's journal and a comprehensive genealogy.

The Walter's left Darmstadt, Germany, in March 1851 with their two children, Michael and Elizabeth Walter. They took a small boat on the River Main to Rotterdam, Holland, where they caught a steamer to London, England and then boarded the sailing vessel "Victoria" on April 1, 1851.

Upon arrival in America, they took a river steamer up the Hudson River in New York to Albany and then through the Erie Canal to Buffalo, where they transferred to a lake steamer for Chicago. There they were met by cousins who took them to Geneva, Illinois. For a time Michael lived on a farm in Du Page County with his sister,

Elizabeth, who had married Boniface Ott.

In 1855, Michael moved to Dixon and then to Lockport in 1856. In 1859 he joined a group of other men going west to look for gold. Back in Illinois during the Civil War, he enlisted in the Union Army and fought in several major engagements, including Shiloh. After the war, he returned to Lockport and opened a grocery and feed store on the northwest corner of 9th and State Streets.

Michael's first marriage was to Margaret Pitt. They had nine children: John (a superintendent of the I&M Canal Office), Fred (a Joliet lawyer), Frank, Bob, Annie, Jennie, Addie, Emma, and Nellie. When Nellie was born, her mother died, and Michael took her to his sister. Elizabeth, where she lived until she finished grade school. Nellie married Howard Sager Norton, grandson of Hiram Norton, early Lockport entrepreneur. Sometime later, Michael married his second wife, Addie Heron, a school teacher. Michael lived at 320 Fifth Street, but on the sidewalk in front of his house is "126" and "M. Walter." He died sometime after 1900 and is buried in the Lockport City Cemetery.

OTT BACKGROUND

Elizabeth Walter's husband, Boniface Ott, emigrated from Baden-Baden, Germany, in 1842. He lived in New York and Canada before coming to Du Page County, Illinois, in 1846. In 1865 he moved his family to Gooding's Grove in Homer Township, just east of Lockport. Boniface and Elizabeth had thirteen children, two of whom died before 1881: Frank, Michael, Eva, Catherine, Mary, Elizabeth, John, Kate, Peter, Clara, Emma, Marguerite and George.

DESCENDANTS OF ELIZABETH WALTER AND BONIFACES' SON MICHAEL:

Many of these surnames are found in Lockport today, and some have already contributed their family histories.
