Fire Extinguisher Regulations

In 2022, the Coast Guard amended portable fire extinguisher rules for recreational vessels in the U.S., making it easier and less costly for millions of boat owners to maintain the onboard fire protection equipment that they need. The rules do not change the number or types of extinguishers required on board but do simplify inspection and record-keeping requirements. The simplified rules also are now published with other recreational boating rules, making it easier to identify them.



America's Boating Channel video [“Fire Extinguisher Regulations”](#) offers an overview of the rules that separates commercial and recreational vessel fire protection requirements. It will help you learn how to ensure that all required portable fire extinguishers comply. Also featured are tips for preventing onboard fires in the first place.



If you need a refresher on classifications and carriage requirements for marine fire extinguishers, the channel offers a second video titled [“Fire Extinguisher Standards.”](#) It offers tips for placing and servicing fire extinguishers, and explains the acronym PASS. Above all, ensure that the proper number of functional fire extinguishers are on board, readily accessible and that all responsible adults on board know to pull, aim, squeeze, and sweep.

U.S. Coast Guard approved marine-type fire extinguishers fully charged and in good and serviceable condition are required on recreational boats where the engines or fuel system could pose a fire hazard. Good and serviceable means that a fire extinguisher aboard a recreational vessel is properly charged and reads charged if it has a pressure gauge reading or charge indicator, that the extinguisher has a pin lock

that is firmly in place, that it does not show visible signs of significant corrosion or damage and has a discharge nozzle that is clean and free from obstructions. Disposable dry chemical extinguishers expire 12 years after their date of manufacture, and rechargeable extinguishers expire annually unless maintained by a certified technician.

Boating Stories and More...

Nine Lives

I was anchored in Silver Lake, Ocracoke, when the word flashed around the anchorage: Storm Warning! In storm conditions the National Park Service allows free docking on their docks. I immediately pulled my anchor and tied my catamaran up to the head of one of their piers. The docks slowly filled up with fellow boaters and an increasing number of commercial fishing boats. Since I was securely tied to the dock I went to walk into what passes in Ocracoke as downtown. When I returned I had a 60' long line fishing boat tied outboard of me. I briefly talked with one of the crew, and lowered my stern lifelines so they could easily walk across my boat to the dock. Since they were much longer than my 36 feet they had run mooring lines past my bow and stern directly to the dock. It was the only interaction I had with them: they arrived while I was off walking and left before me.

The wind huffed and puffed, and a steady progression of squalls passed overhead. The strongest blasts of wind did little more than create patches of dancing water which would ripple across the surface of Silver Lake: it really lived up to its reputation as a Harbor of Refuge. During breaks in the storm the increasingly stir crazy boat crews began to venture out of their boats and gather to chit chat on the pier. I was surprised to discover I was the only boat moored to the pier that was headed north for the summer. My surrounding boaters were all “locals”, using Ocracoke as an Outer Banks destination for a holiday cruise from one of the ports, like Oriental, on the mainland side of the Pamlico Sound.

During one of our social gatherings I noticed a half grown cat swimming around between the moored boats. The water level was too far down to reach and neither of the boats had swim platforms. I enlisted the aid of one of the captains and had him hold my legs as I stretched down toward the desperate cat. I used my Mom’s call: “kitty, kitty, here kitty”. The cat saw me and immediately veered towards my hand. But it wasn’t interested in letting me pick it up: it latched on with the claws in its front paws, then scampered up my stretched arm, over my shoulder and across my back, and from there jumped onto the dock. Its claws gripped the whole way: Ouch! I hauled myself back up to the dock to watch the soaking wet cat run down the pier past several boats then jump across the shortest distance from the dock to the deck of one of the sailboats. It ran down the side deck and disappeared into the hatch of what was clearly “its” boat.

The next morning, during another one of our between rain squall pier gatherings, I noticed the Captain of the cat’s chosen sailboat. I explained that we had used a team effort to rescue a swimming cat which had then run directly onto his boat. His face lit up: “So that’s why my pillow was all wet!”









Remember that deeeeeelicious homemade macaroni and cheese we all enjoyed at Laraine and David's Cedar Key Fish Fry last month? Welllll...you asked for it, and now, you shall receive...Many thanks to Robyn Frangie for sharing this very yummy recipe!!

Homemade Baked Mac & Cheese

INGREDIENTS

- 16 oz elbow macaroni, cooked (or other tubular pasta)
- 1 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 6 tbsp unsalted butter
- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- 3 cups whole milk
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream
- 4 cups sharp cheddar cheese, shredded
- 2 cups Gruyere cheese, shredded
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1 1/2 cups panko crumbs
- 4 tbsp butter melted
- 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese, shredded
- 1/4 tsp smoked paprika (or regular paprika)



INSTRUCTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 350F. Lightly grease a large 3 qt or 4 qt baking dish and set aside. Combine shredded cheeses in a large bowl and set aside.
2. Cook the pasta one minute shy of al dente according to the package instructions. Remove from heat, drain, and place in a large bowl.
3. Drizzle pasta with olive oil and stir to coat pasta. Set aside to cool while preparing cheese sauce.

4. Melt butter in a deep saucepan, dutch oven, or stock pot.
5. Whisk in flour over medium heat and continue whisking for about 1 minute until bubbly and golden.
6. Gradually whisk in the milk and heavy cream until nice and smooth. Continue whisking until you see bubbles on the surface and then continue cooking and whisking for another 2 minutes. Whisk in salt and pepper.
7. Add two cups of shredded cheese and whisk until smooth. Add another two cups of shredded cheese and continue whisking until creamy and smooth. Sauce should be nice and thick.
8. Stir in the cooled pasta until combined and pasta is fully coated with the cheese sauce.
9. Pour half of the mac and cheese into the prepared baking dish. Top with the remaining 2 cups of shredded cheese and then the remaining mac and cheese.
10. In a small bowl, combine panko crumbs, Parmesan cheese, melted butter and paprika. Sprinkle over the top and bake until bubbly and golden brown, about 30 minutes. Serve immediately.






