### **Stage 1: Online Application**

### **Stage 2: UCWE Course**

Complete the University Certificate in Workforce Essentials (delivered online by Charles Sturt University). This is mandatory prior to training at the academy.

### **Stage 3: Background & Integrity Checks**

A detailed vetting process includes police checks, reference checks, and digital footprint screening.

### **Stage 4: Physical Capacity Testing**

Demonstrates your ability to handle the physical demands of policing (includes endurance, strength, and agility tasks).

### **Stage 5: Final Assessment & Offer**

If successful, you'll be invited to commence training at the NSW Police Academy in Goulburn.

## 7. Academy Training: What to Expect

Training takes place at the **NSW Police Academy in Goulburn**, combining academic learning with physical and practical training.

- Duration: **16 weeks on-campus** training (Session 2 of Associate Degree)
- Topics include:
  - Law and policing powers
  - Defensive tactics and firearms
  - Emergency response and first aid
  - Cultural awareness and ethics
  - Mental health and resilience
- Upon graduation, recruits are sworn in as **Probationary Constables** and deployed to stations across NSW.
